FRIARS' MIND

Some years ago a great Capuchin preacher, Father Bertin Roll, director of the Confraternity of Christian Mothers, published a book of prayers for mothers entitled Mother Love. Perhaps some grandmothers still have a copy. The gospel for this Mother's Day reminds one of Fr. Bertin's book. There are eight verses in today's gospel reading, and the word love appears eight times. This cannot be mere coincidence. Consider each of these references and how they so fittingly express the ideals of a mother's love and how such love should be returned by her children.

As the Father loves me, so I also love you.

God's love for his children is the pattern for a mother's love for her children. In the Scriptures we learn that God's love is steadfast, forgiving, and totally unmerited. St. John wrote, "Love consists in this: not that we have loved God, but that He has loved us." (1Jn 4:10) What a marvelous description of a mother's love for her children.

Remain in my love.

Scripture itself offers a most fitting commentary on this verse: "Can a mother forget her infant, be without tenderness for the child of her womb?" (Is 49:15)

If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love.

A mother loves even her wayward children, but children know a mother's love best when she is honored by the way they live. It is a reward of a mother's love.

I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love.

Cards, candy, and carnations are nice ways to gratefully remember our mother. But the most treasured gift and the greatest reassurance of her love is to live as she taught us.

Love one another as I love you.

Children learn many things from their mother: to walk, to talk, to read, and to pray. But the example of her love for them, and her goodness to others, are the most valuable lessons a mother teaches her children.

No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends.

Some mothers have fulfilled this ideal literally when they died in childbirth. Yet many faithful mothers have laid down their lives for their children daily, by sacrificing comfort, convenience, and career that their children might have a better life.

This I command you: love one another.

A noble mother does not seek the praise and adulation of her family, only their health, happiness, and holiness. A mother's love can never be repaid; it can only be passed on.

I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy might be complete.

. . . . and mirth

A mother understands what a child does not say, which is a mixed blessing.

As by now most of us know, a 7.8-magnitude earthquake struck Nepal on April 25, toppling buildings and homes, causing widespread panic, and claiming thousands of lives.

A special collection will be taken up at all Masses on May 16-17.

Our Church mourns the terrible suffering of our brothers and sisters affected by this catastrophe. Please join with the Catholic community across the United States in responding to our suffering brothers and sisters through a special collection for the works of Catholic Relief Services in Nepal.

Catholic Relief Services has already begun a major response to this crisis, providing 10,000 families (50,000 people) with emergency shelter materials, blankets, water treatment, and hygiene kits. Given the scale of the disaster, the agency expects to expand relief activities. Your assistance is greatly appreciated.

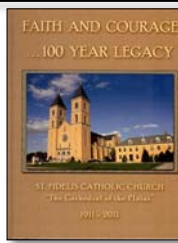
