Catechetical Sunday



Peter approached Jesus and asked him, "Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive? As many as seven times?" Jesus answered.

"I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times."

(from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew 18:21-35)



"My heavenly father will treat you in the same way, unless each of you forgives your brother from your heart." That is the concluding verse of today's gospel and is one of the most sobering of all scripture. We set our own standard for God's mercy to us.

Everyone has difficulty with forgiveness. Perhaps it is a friend or a neighbor, a spouse or a child, an in-law or an outlaw whom we need to forgive or by whom we need to be forgiven. But too often it does not happen. And it is troubling.

Great literature imposes demanding standards of forgiveness. In Shakespeare's *Merchant of Venice*, Portia challenges Shylock, "Mercy is twice blessed. It blesses the one who gives and the one who receives." In Dostoyevsky's *Brothers Karamazov*, Ivan is haunted by his inability to forgive Dmitri, the murderer of his father. In Milton's *Paradise Lost*, Satan is offered reconciliation which he adamantly refuses.

Christians may feel a special pique from today's gospel command to forgive seventy times seven times, which is effectively always. The dimension of self incrimination is added to this difficult commandment by today's gospel parable of the servant unwilling to forgive a fellow servant, "My heavenly father will treat you in the same way, unless each of you forgives your brother from your heart." (Mt 18:35)

The Lord's Prayer echoes this familiar gospel standard of forgiveness which is repeated again in the verse immediately following the prayer: "If you do not forgive others, neither will your Father forgive you." (Mt 6:15) To be forgiven according to our own mercy is often misunderstood as though God were a petulant child, "If you are not nice to me, I will not be nice to you." The refusal of forgiveness expressed in this prayer is not that God withholds mercy from the sinner but that a hardened heart is not open to accept forgiveness. An unforgiving heart is so suspicious, vengeful, and untrusting that it cannot accept forgiveness when it is offered. The unforgiving are unforgivable.

As an angry heart punishes itself more than the object of its anger, an unforgiving heart prevents itself from being forgiven. To accept forgiveness in your heart you must have forgiven another from your heart. Only those who love can truly be loved. Only those who have suffered can be compassionate. Only the generous can appreciate a gift. And only the forgiving can be forgiven. Faithful Christians are to be forgiven forgivers.

Since the mercy of God is infinite some propose a blanket release of all indebtedness without any need of contrition. Such cheap mercy, a trivial forgiveness granted to the unrepentant, would damage both justice and morality. The command of Christ is to "preach repentance for the forgiveness of sins." (Lk 24:47) The gospel nuance is to offer mercy in such a way as to elicit sincere contrition without imposing a humiliation. Repentance cannot be exacted and justice is not vengeance.

The forgiveness that we too often fail to offer or receive is a complex virtue requiring a prudent balance of compassion and correction, patience and penance, mercy and morality. "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us."



To obtain a plenary indulgence during a pilgrimage to a basilica, one must participate in any sacred rite or recite the Lord's Prayer or the profession of faith while there, then go to Confession and Communion and pray for the intention of the pope.
