

Catechetical Sunday

Catechetical Sunday is celebrated today. This year's theme is "Enlisting witnesses for Jesus Christ." This is a wonderful Opportunity to reflect on the role that each person plays, by virtue of Baptism, in handing on the faith and being a witness to the Gospel. This is an opportunity for all to rededicate ourselves to this mission as a community of faith. Parents are truly the primary catechists of their children. They prepare the soil and plant the first seeds of faith. Today, we not only highlight the work of catechists in parishes and schools, but we also commend parents and guardians and encourage them to take seriously their role of making their Catholic households a place where faith is passed on to the next generation.

Identity Theft

Identity theft is a major concern in our age. Our computers, cell phones, and credit cards are all subject to the theft of our password, pin, and social security numbers. Today's gospel is about the identity of Christ. In our age, rationalists, theists, and even some Christians are trying to give Christ an identity different than that of the gospels. This is the danger of a theological identity theft.

In today's gospel Christ asked his disciples a twofold question. The first is but an introductory question, "Who do **people** say that I am?" The disciples replied, "John the Baptist, Elijah, or one of the prophets." All good answers, but not quite correct. The crowds had confused the identity of Christ.

John the Baptist preached the same message as Christ, "Repent, for the kingdom of God is at hand." Elijah, as John the Baptist, was the same type of prophet as Christ, one announcing the kingdom of God. Yes, Christ was one of the prophets. But he was more. He was *the* prophet.

After the disciples' response to that preliminary question, Christ then turned to the crucial question, the most important question of all history, "Who do you say that I am?" Peter answered correctly, "You are the Christ." But Peter's understanding of Christ as the Messiah was incomplete. As many who accept Jesus, Peter projected onto Christ an identity of his own preference.

It is one thing to profess that Christ is the Messiah. It is quite another thing to recognize that he is the suffering servant Messiah who had to die and rise. That is the uncomfortable part of Christ that St. Peter avoided. Yet, even to profess that Christ is the suffering Messiah is not enough. We must allow the mystery of

his death and resurrection to govern our own life.



We Christians need to be clear as to what we believe about the identity of Christ. He is not just the Good Shepherd, the Gentle Galilean, or the Prince of Peace. Even unbelievers concede those titles, in a subtle form of identity theft. Christ is all those things and more. He is the promised Messiah, the Divine Son of God. He is Emmanuel, the very presence of God with us and within us. He is the One who died and rose for our salvation. Jesus is the suffering Messiah who cannot be understood apart from the mystery of the cross. Anything less is not the Christ of the Gospels. It is identity theft. "Who do **you** say that I am?"

Abortion stops a beating heart.

Abortion advocates usually refer to the human being growing in her/his mother's womb in dehumanizing terms like "product of conception" and suggest that most abortions are done before fetal organs are functioning.



Actually, the vast majority are done after the fetal heart has begun beating. A baby's heart begins to beat at about 21 or 22 days after fertilization. That's at about 3 weeks of development. The vast majority of abortions in the United States are done well after this point. 2

PLENARY INDULGENCE GIVEN WHEN VISITING A BASILICA

The faithful may obtain a plenary indulgence by visiting a minor basilica. An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment for a previously forgiven sin. To obtain a plenary indulgence during a pilgrimage to a basilica, one must participate in any sacred rite or recite the Lord's Prayer or the profession of faith while there, then go to Confession and Communion and pray for the intention of the pope.
