A King yet not a King

Today the church celebrates the *Solemnity of Christ the King*. This feast was established in 1925 by Pope Pius XI as a response to the rise of secularism in Europe. Modern philosophers were trying to undermine the significance of Christianity. They rejected the gospel teachings of Christ and the voice of the church in modern society.

In his encyclical which instituted this feast, Pope Pius XI proposed that this celebration among Christians would remind nationalistic leaders that Christ occupies a significant and enduring place in history; that his Church has the right to live its faith free from control by the state; that Christ reigns in the hearts and minds of his followers; and that the kingship of Christ is a noble model for all leaders.

Christ as king does not rival secular kings or heads of state. The kingdom of Christ is a different domain. When Pilate asked if he were a king Jesus replied, "My kingdom is not of this world." Yet the manner of his reign, a king of gracious service who

commanded his followers to be servants as well, can inspire secular rulers to a more effective leadership. The humble service of Christ the King was to the point of his redemptive passion, death and

resurrection.



When Christ the King judge the comes nations at the parusia, iustice will tempered with mercy. Christ as King is not a domineering ruler, but one whose power is that of service. Christ the King does not have subjects, he has followers. He does not compel, he invites. He does not enforce, he

The Feast of Christ the King was established as an antidote to secularism which denies the existence of God and his place in history and our personal life. Wealth, power, and honor then become kings. That temptation is very present in our age. Today's feast is intended to proclaim Christ's reign over the minds and hearts of his follower and, properly understood, nations.

The challenging message of Christ the King is that his crown is of thorns and his throne is the cross. The preface of today's Mass describes well the kingdom of Christ: "A kingdom of truth and life, a kingdom of holiness and grace, a kingdom of justice, love

and peace." s we pray in the Lord's Prayer, "Thy kingdom come."



THE LEGEND Christmas Tree

What Christmas would be complete without the glittering fir, filling the house with color and warmth?

But whence the custom of the Christmas Tree? The pine fir certainly wasn't present in Oriental Bethlehem, when Jesus was born. Rather, palm trees grow in the East, and are often depicted around the Crèche.

So, why don't we decorate a palm tree, rather than a fir tree? Is the custom even Christian, we may ask?

Indeed, that Christmas tree standing in our living room has an ancient, wonderful history. And though the custom began pagan. it was "Baptized" and adopted by the wisdom of a great saint.

Saint Boniface was an Englishman who lived in the eighth century and who felt called to evangelize the German nation.

One of the pagan German gods was a great oak tree called "Thunder Oak in honor of the god Thor. usually a child, under the mighty oak.

One year, fired by holy anger. Boniface decided to do away with the barbaric custom and bravely showed up with an ax just in time to prevent the killing. Before the astounded revelers, he

proceeded to hack away at the massive trunk.

Legend has it that a miraculous gust of wind pushed down the tree at the first blows. Impressed that the "god" did not strike down the daring priest, the pagans accepted Christianity.

As the giant oak collapsed, standing there was a small fir tree that, somehow, escaped destruction.

Pointing to it, the holy man said:

"This little tree, a young child of the forest, shall be your holy tree tonight. It is the wood of peace...It is the sign of an endless life, for its leaves are ever green. See how it points upward to heaven. Let this be called the tree of the Christ-child; gather about it, not in the wild wood, but in your own homes; there it will shelter no deeds of blood, but loving gifts and rites of kindness."






