The Other Wise Man

The gospel does not tell us how many wise men came to adore the Christ child. We assume three Magi from three gifts. Ancient traditions had four for the four evangelists or twelve for the twelve apostles. In 1902, Henry van Dyke wrote an inspiring novel, "The Story of the Other Wise Man." A DVD version is available and is wholesome entertainment in this holiday season.

His novel is about a fourth wise man, Artaban, who had planned to travel with Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. He bought three jewels as gifts for the infant king: a sapphire, a ruby, and a pearl. But on the day of departure he stopped to help an injured child and missed the caravan. So he sold the sapphire to outfit a second expedition. When he arrived at Bethlehem, the Holy Family had fled to Egypt. But he did rescue one of the Holy Innocents by bribing a soldier with the ruby.

With only the pearl remaining, he set out again to find the new King. When he was close to meeting the Messiah, a cry for help from the unfortunate always delayed him. Thirty years later in Jerusalem he heard that a man was condemned to death who claimed to be the Messiah King. Artaban thought this might be the king he was seeking, so he decided to ransom him with his pearl. But on his way to the praetorium he saw a slave auction where a girl was being sold into bondage. He bought the young woman with the pearl and set her free.

He had now given away his last tribute to the new King, and he had not found him. Suddenly the skies darkened, there was an earthquake, and Artaban was crushed by falling rock. In his dying moments Artaban saw the clouds part and a voice said, "Whatever you have done to the least of my children, you have done to me." Artaban died knowing that he had found the King many times.

Van Dykes story is a parable. Artaban is every Christian. We are all on a journey in search of the Messiah King. We have been entrusted with many gifts to offer him. Like Artaban we will not meet the infant King in person. But on our journey we will meet Him in many others and our gifts to them will be our gifts to Him. "Whatever you have done to the least of my children, you have done to me." Our journey is the journey of the Other Wise Man.

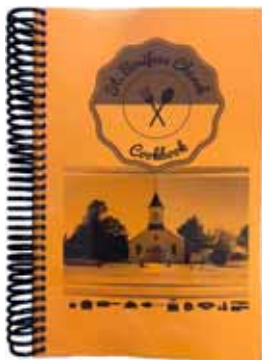

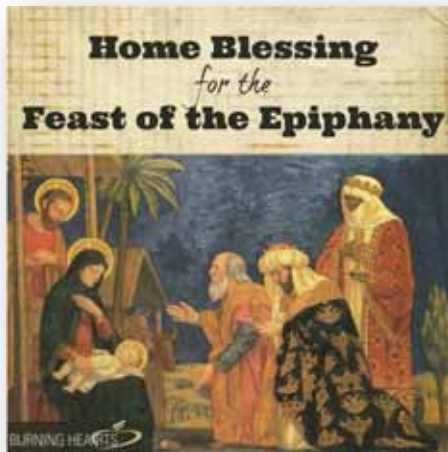

THE MONTH OF *January*

Don't put away the Christmas decorations quite yet. The season of Christmas isn't over. The Catholic Church celebrates the season of Christmas over a span of 12 days. The 12 days of Christmas begin on December 25 and end on January 5, the day before the feast of the Epiphany (which celebrates the day when the Magi-Wise Men discovered Jesus.) These two important feast days and the twelve days of Christmas give us time to celebrate Jesus' birth at Mass and discover how we can bring his love to people in our everyday lives. [Editor's Note: According to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (usccb.org), the liturgical season of Christmas begins with the vigil Masses on Christmas Eve and concludes on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. According to catholiccompany.com, the Christmas feast proper ends on the final day of its octave, which is the feast of Mary, the Mother of God, on January 1st. The "peak" of the Christmas "season" is January 6th—Epiphany—the end of the 12 Days of Christmas. The official end of the entire Christmas season on the new liturgical calendar is the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord, after which Ordinary Time begins.]



The Feast of Epiphany commemorates the Magi who followed a star to find the Christ-child. The Feast of Epiphany blessing asks that we might find the Lord when our pilgrimage is ended. It also reminds us that we should be looking for God and finding Him, all along the way. Catholics traditionally bless their homes on Epiphany night with holy water.

Pray that all who enter your home will be treated with dignity and love, and that those who come there might find, as did the Magi on their journey, the true and ever-living Christ.

PLENARY INDULGENCE GIVEN WHEN VISITING A BASILICA

The faithful may obtain a plenary indulgence by visiting a minor basilica. An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment for a previously forgiven sin. To obtain a plenary indulgence during a pilgrimage to a basilica, one must participate in any sacred rite or recite the Lord’s Prayer or the profession of faith while there, then go to Confession and Communion and pray for the intention of the pope.
