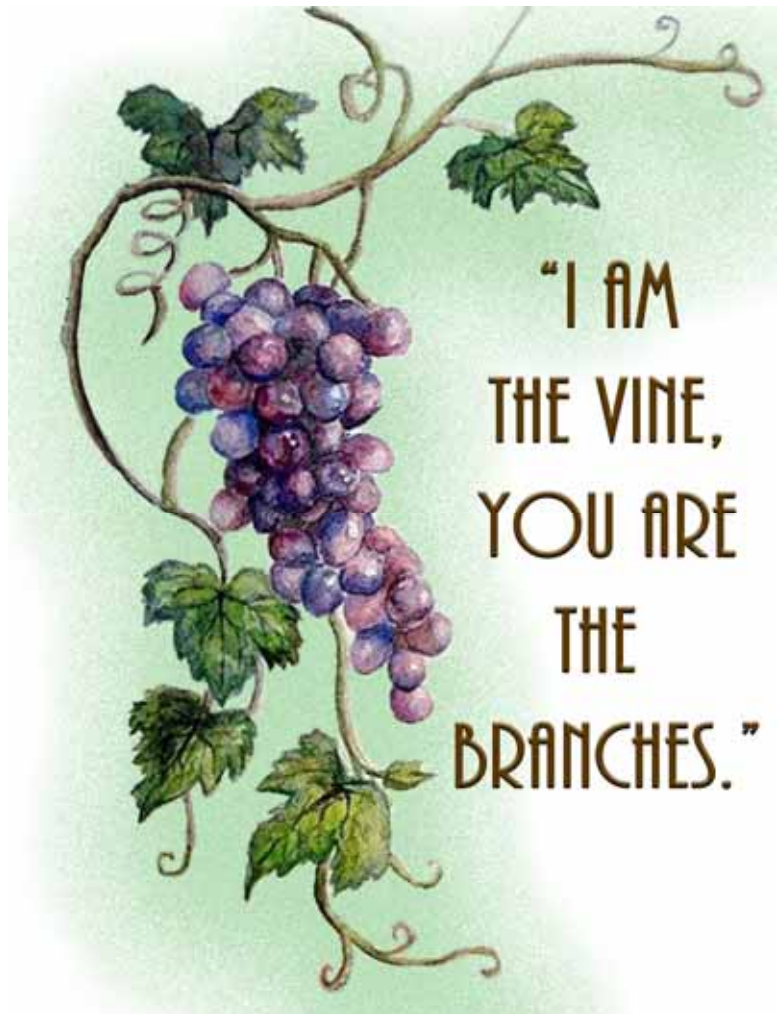

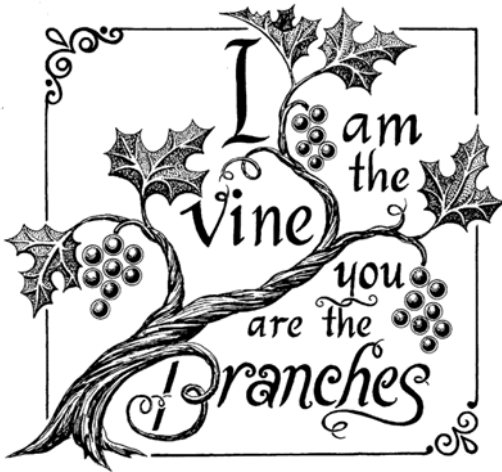

(from the Holy Gospel according to John 15:1-8)



There are no parables in the gospel of John. In the other gospels, Matthew Mark, and Luke, which are known as the synoptic gospels, Jesus teaches mostly with parables. But in John's gospel Jesus preaches with personal discourses, metaphors, and analogies. Jesus says things like: "I am the bread of life." "I am the light of the world." "I am the resurrection and the life." "I am the way and the truth and the life."



Two of the analogies in John's gospel, that Jesus is the shepherd and the vine, are developed more extensively than the others. In the tenth chapter of John, Jesus elaborates on himself as the good shepherd who lays down his life for his sheep, the sheep gate who guards his flock, and the shepherd who leads his sheep gathering them into one flock. (Jn 10)

In today's gospel reading from the fifteenth chapter of John, Jesus develops the analogy of the vine and the branches. "I am the vine and you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit." (Jn 15:5) The significance of this analogy is that it offers a concrete image of grace, one of the most significant yet elusive theological concepts of our faith. Grace is the unseen means by which we share in the life of God.

The essence of Christianity is the incarnation, the historical fact that God took on our human form in Jesus of Nazareth. It follows that if God shared in our life, we then in some way share in the life of God. This is a fundamental teaching of our Christian faith. Many expressions of this truth can be found in the gospel of John: "Remain in me as I remain in you." (Jn 15:2) "Just as you and I are one, Father, may they be one in us." (Jn 7:21) "I am the bread of life. Whoever eats this bread will live forever." (Jn 6:45)

Those words of our Lord express well the concept of grace, yet the full import of them may easily escape us as words alone often do. The analogy of the vine and branches, however, gives us a familiar mental picture from our own experience with living plants. Even an amateur gardener will appreciate the meaning of these words: "Just as a branch cannot bear fruit of its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me." (Jn 15: 4)

In his commentary on this gospel Pope Francis emphasized that followers of Christ must bear fruit from their union with the vine. "Each one of us is a branch of the one vine that is Jesus; and all of us together are called to bear the fruits of union with Christ and the Church. We are to be living branches in the Church and witness in the world. According to our own particular vocation, we participate in the one saving mission of Jesus Christ, the Lord."
