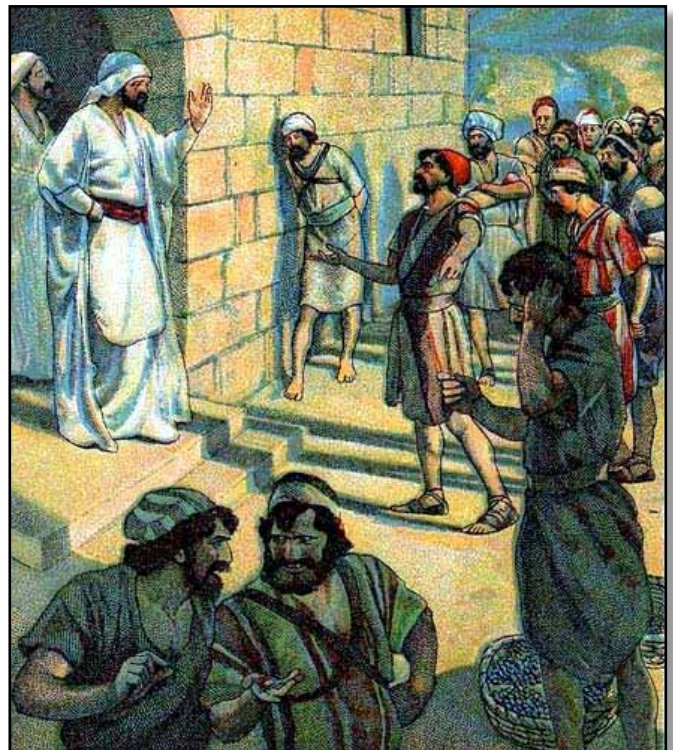

This Tuesday, September 23, is the feast of Saint Pio of Pietrelcina, popularly known as Padre Pio. This Capuchin priest, canonized by Pope John Paul II on June 16, 2002, is one of the most popular of our modern saints.

Padre Pio was born Francesco Forgione in 1887 in the small Italian village of Pietrelcina. He entered the Capuchin order in 1903, taking the name Pio, and was ordained a priest in 1910. He spent the remainder of his life at the monastery of San Giovanni Rotondo, except for one year of forced military service during the First World War.

Padre Pio suffered ill health most of his life and was instrumental in founding a large hospital near the friary which is renown for expert medical care in an atmosphere of faith. He was much sought-after as a spiritual adviser, confessor, and intercessor. Despite such demands for his time, his life was devoted primarily to prayer, especially Eucharist devotion. He was troubled by his fame and would often say, "I only want to be a simple friar who prays quietly." He died on September 23, 1968, at age 81. He is the patron saint of confessors, the depressed, civil defense volunteers, and adolescents.

Much of the fame of Padre Pio, and no little controversy, center around the fact that he was marked with the five sacred wounds of Christ, the stigmata. Early in his priesthood, these wounds appeared on his hands, his feet, and his side. And they remained for the rest of his life. Unfortunately, public reaction to his wounds often invited a sensationalism which distracts from authentic faith. At one point, his superiors thought it best that he refrain from public priestly duties, such as saying Mass and hearing confessions.

Many medical experts, including agnostics, examined his wounds and testified to their reality, but were unable to heal them. These painful wounds bled, and he normally covered them for privacy as well as hygiene. When he died, medical experts again examined his body and found that the wounds had disappeared without leaving any scars or marks as normal wounds do.

Other notable people have been reported as stigmatic (St. Catherine of Siena, St. Veronica, St. John of God, St. Faustina, St. Rita, Theresa Neumann) but the Catholic Church has been very cautious about endorsing these claims. Some suggest that St. Paul was a stigmatic because he wrote, "I bear the marks of Jesus on my body." St. Francis of Assisi was also marked with the wounds of Christ, and his is the only approved liturgical celebration of the stigmata (September 17).

Our own Father Clement Naef, as a soldier stationed in Italy during the Second World War, had a personal visit with Padre Pio. Fr. Clem credited that visit with his conversion to Catholicism and his vocation to the priesthood in the Capuchin Order.
