


He has done all things well. He makes the deaf hear and the mute speak.

(from the Holy Gospel according to Mark 7:31-37)



No one is so deaf as the one who does not want to hear, counsels an ancient proverb. Children hear the faintest sound of a candy wrapper but can be stone deaf when told to clean their room. Teenagers never miss a word on their cell phone yet do not hear their homework assignment. A mechanic can hear a subtle change in a motor, but not his wife's reminder of their anniversary. Most of us have selective hearing. No one is so deaf as the one who does not want to hear.

In today's gospel Christ enabled the deaf mute to hear and to speak. That was the physical miracle. There was also a miracle of grace. He opened the man's ears to hear the message of the gospel, and freed his tongue to speak the praises of God. The physical miracle makes the miracle of grace visible.



We also need that grace to hear the quiet voice of God in our heart. Our deafness is often in prayer, as when we are distracted. Our mind is elsewhere. Usually on ourselves. When inattentive while another is speaking, we ask demurely, "Did you say something?" How often does that happen in prayer, and we need to say humbly to the Lord, "Did you say something?"

Our selective hearing applies also to the word of God. Too often we hear what we want to hear but not what will challenge us. When scripture says that God is kind and merciful, we hear that loud and clear. But when the gospel calls us to repent, the words can fall on deaf ears. Another form of selective hearing is presuming what others will say before they finish. We resent that when we are the one speaking. Too often we think we know the message of a gospel from one familiar verse. So we hear the same thing we heard the last time. We are not open to a new or deeper understanding and we miss what the gospel is saying to us today.

Aware of our selective hearing and spiritual deafness, Jesus said, "I speak in

parables because they look but they do to see, and hear but do not listen or understand. Many prophets and righteous people longed to see what you see but did not see it, and longed to hear what you hear but did not hear it." (Mt 13:8)

St. Jerome once fell asleep while reading the scriptures and dreamt that Christ appeared and

asked him, "What are you reading?" St. Jerome answered, "I am reading the Word of God," "No," replied Christ, "You are reading your own words." Thereafter, before his study of scripture Jerome would pray, "Lord, speak again your 'Ephphatha' that the deaf ears of my heart may be opened."

LEARN:

Abortion fails women.

Abortion is often portrayed as essential for women to achieve freedom and equality with men, yet many report feeling some degree of pressure or aborting to please someone else—often their partner. Further, after the abortion, many women report feelings of depression,



suicidal or self-harm inclinations, sadness, shame, and regret.2

For example, Cynthia Carney in an amicus brief submitted to the Supreme Court described the aftermath of her abortion saying, "For 23 years, I went into crying spells, depression, suicidal thoughts. Emotionally it devastated me." Camelia Murphy explained, "I have suffered with low self-esteem, self-hatred, suicidal impulses, constant anxiety (especially about sex and about making decisions)." Donna Razin said that her abortion caused her "[d]eep regret – initially I was suicidal – as the years have progressed I have developed a heightened level of bitterness and anger and self-hate." Women would be better served if society tried to creatively answer the needs of single mothers, mothers trying to get through school, mothers needing higher or more stable finances, etc. rather than telling them that the death of their children is the best answer. We can and should do better for all women.
