Fathers Day would not be complete without a reflection on our heavenly Father, the model for all earthly fathers. When we pray the Lord's Prayer, the Our Father, we begin with three petitions *for* the Father, and then we ask three petitions *from* the Father.

The petitions *for* the Father are: Hallowed be Thy name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done. Our petitions *from* the Father are: Give us our daily bread, forgive us our trespasses, and deliver us from evil. These petitions also resonate with the vocation of earthly fathers.



Hallowed be Thy name. Our imperfect earthly fathers deserve respect. The fourth commandments says, "Honor your father and your mother that you may enjoy a long life in the land the Lord is giving you." Scripture also says, "Help your father in his old age; and do not despise him in your strength." (Eccl 3:12)

Thy kingdom come. Earthly fathers have been called to establish a family. In the best sense of the word that family is their kingdom in which they are not lords but responsible servants. "The greatest among you shall be your servant." (Mt 23:11)

Thy will be done. Children owe obedience to their fathers, whose commands are to reflect the will of God. "Thy will be done, on earth, as it is in heaven." The Bible reminds us, "Those who honor their father will have joy in their own children." (Eccl 3:5)

The Lord's Prayer continues with three requests *from* our heavenly Father.

Give us our daily bread. Fathers must provide for the needs of their children, and it is their joy to do so. "Your children shall be like olive plants around your table." (Ps 128:3)

Forgive our trespasses. Fathers must forgive the faults of their children. The father of the prodigal son is their model. He forgave both his stupid younger son and also his stubborn older son.

Deliver us from evil. The most fundamental physical responsibility of fathers is to protect their children from harm. Sigmund Freud wrote: "There is no need in childhood greater than a child's need for a father's protection."

Happy Fathers Day to all our fathers and Fathers.
