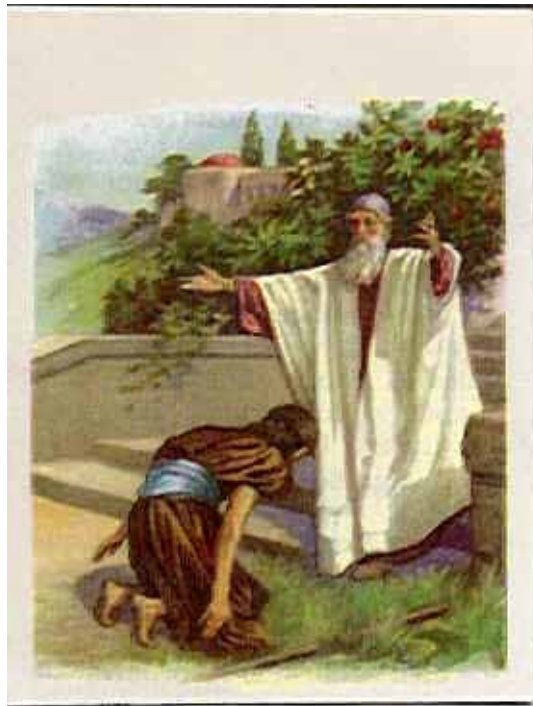

# GIRL SCOUT SUNDAY



**“...We must celebrate and rejoice, because your brother was dead and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found.”**

(from the Holy Gospel according to Luke 15:1-3, 11-32)



Where were the women? We have the prodigal son, the older brother, and their forgiving father. Where were the sisters of the prodigal son during this crisis? How does his mother fit into the story?

A disappointed feminist might say that the Scriptures are patriarchal and dismissive of women. But it was Christ who gave us this parable and that can hardly be said of him. His concern for women was genuinely inclusive, even by modern standards, and certainly unusual for that time in history.

An idealist might say there are no prodigal daughters. Boys make a mess; girls don't. Yet there are prodigal daughters in the Bible: Rahab the Canaanite prostitute (Jos 2:1), Bathsheba the unfaithful wife of Uriah (2 Sam 11:1), the sinful women who washed the feet of Christ with her tears (Lk 7:45), and the woman caught in adultery (Jn 7:53).

But where are the women in the reconciliation of the Prodigal Son? The mother of the prodigal son is not mentioned explicitly, but she is there implicitly. Her presence would have been understood by those who first heard this story. A missing child is the concern of both parents, but especially of a mother. Scripture says: Can a mother forget her infant or be without tenderness for the child of her womb?

Parables are meant to stir our imagination and in this parable we readily picture the dialogue of mother and father over the absent son. Such forgiveness from a father for an errant son had to be greatly influenced by his wife. Perhaps the story has such an impact because while we assume that a mother would offer such forgiveness, the magnanimous mercy of the father is surprising.

In the larger story there is a woman in this parable because the Parable of the Prodigal Son does not stand alone. It is part of a triplet of parables about finding what is lost: the lost sheep, the lost coin, and the lost son. The feminine complement of the parable of the Prodigal Son is the woman with the lost coin. (Lk 15:8) Just as the shepherd leaves the ninety nine and goes in search of the one stray, and the father runs out to welcome his repentant son, the woman with ten coins who lost one lights a lamp and sweeps the house until she finds it. And when she does find it, she calls together her friends and neighbors and says "Rejoice with me because I have found the coin I lost." (Lk 15:9)

The Scriptures are rich in stories of the mercy and forgiveness of both women and men, as is the story of our own life.


