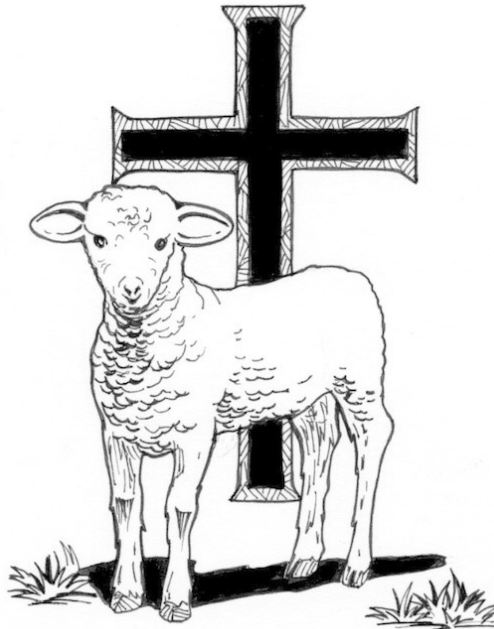
The Sin(s) of the World

There is a subtle wording in today's gospel that carries a significant message. When John the Baptist saw Christ approaching him he said, "Behold, the Lamb of God who takes away the **sin** of the world." Note the singular, **sin**. At Mass we pray, "Lamb of God who takes away the **sins** of the world." Note the plural, **sins**. Neither is a typo. There is a scriptural and a theological difference between **sin** and **sins**.

Sin is the sinful condition where evil itself resides. Sins are individual acts of human failure that allow evil to prevail at that moment. We are sinners but we are not evil. Only Satan is evil personified. On the cross Christ conquered **sin**, the evil of Satan, and by that victory over evil itself our individual **sins** can be forgiven.

In today's gospel, when John the Baptist said, "Behold, the Lamb of God who takes away the **sin** of the world" he was foretelling the victory of Christ on the cross. And John did that with the Old Testament image of the Paschal Lamb of the Exodus. At Mass we are asking Christ to have mercy and forgive our individual sins by referring to the same image, "the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world, have mercy on us."

You will recall in the story of the Exodus that the Israelites were told to slaughter a young lamb for their festive meal and then mark the lintel of their doors with the blood of that sacrificed Lamb. The angel of death, the tenth and final plague, would then not enter their home nor take the life of their first born. The blood of the lamb, a sacred sacrifice, would keep them safe from death. That is an Old Testament image of how the blood of Christ, who is the Lamb of God, preserves his



faithful people from the death of sin in the New Testament, the New Covenant.

We relive that moment of our redemption at every Mass, even employing the same symbolic language. In preparation for receiving Communion, our participation in the saving grace of the Eucharist, the celebrant says, "Blessed are those who are called to the Supper of the Lamb." And we respond, "Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world, have mercy on us."

By participating in Mass we acknowledge that Christ, the sacrificial Paschal Lamb, has conquered **sin**, and we ask him to forgive our **sins**. Amen!
