The End of the World

Environmentalists warn us that we might be destroying our planet. When the Bible refers to the end of the world its message is not scientific but allegorical and apocalyptic. Such passages are mostly in the Book of Daniel and the Book of Revelation, but each gospel also has a mini apocalypse. We read these on the final Sunday of the liturgical year with this paradoxical message: the end of the world will not be the end of the world.

The biblical concept of the end of the world has multiple meanings: the collapse of the cosmic universe, the moment of each individual's death, and those tragic moments when our lives become unraveled.

Apocalyptic scripture was never intended to instill despair or fear about such transitions, but to offer hope and courage in our present struggle. During the persecution of the early church this symbolic language was understood by the Christians as assuring them that their suffering was not the end of the church nor the end of the world.

People unfamiliar with allegorical writings may misinterpret such passages of the Bible. Apocalyptic scripture is not a time prediction nor a scientific description of the final days. It is not doomsday fire and brimstone. It is, rather, the promise that goodness will ultimately triumph.

The Second Vatican Council said of the end of the world: "We do not know the time of the end of the earth and of humanity. Nor do we know how all

things will be transformed. The shape of this world, now deformed by sin, will pass away. And God is preparing a new dwelling where justice will abide. Meanwhile during the time that is left, we are to nurture human dignity, freedom, peace, and all that is good in this life, for we will find them again, but free of stain, and transfigured."

The end of the cosmic world will not be a disaster, but a fulfillment. It will be a transformation of this world into the promised kingdom of God. Apocalyptic Scripture is about the struggle between divine goodness and demonic evil with the promise that goodness will triumph because God is good, loving, and faithful.

So whether your present anxiety is the environmental collapse of the earth or the loss of our cultural values or the upheaval of your personal world, the message of the gospel is that divine goodness will triumph over evil and every cosmic ending will be the beginning of something new and better. The end of the world will not be the end of the world.

For many people, a speeding ticket usually means a bit of embarrassment, a fine, or the inconvenience of appearing in court. But for those living in poverty, a speeding ticket can become a life-altering event.

Contempt of court citations and unlicensed driving tickets quickly compounded the initial fine. Donald was losing hope that he could clear the backlog, get a better-paying job, and support his growing family while living right above the poverty level.

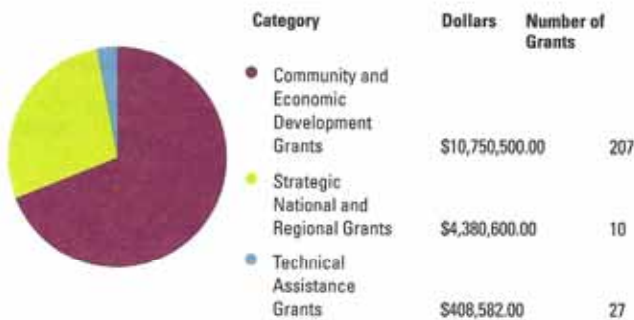
Thanks to your generosity to CCHD, the New Orleans Workers Center for Racial Justice (NOWCRJ) was able to provide Donald with the support he needed to change his situation. NOWCRJ hosted a clinic where Donald set up payment plans for his fines and got his license reinstated. Now Donald has a new job and has

been able to save money to move into his own apartment. NOWCRJ is also working with the judicial system to reduce backlogs, expunge records, and change how penalties are issued. With your contributions, our brothers and sisters across the country are breaking out of the cycle of poverty.
