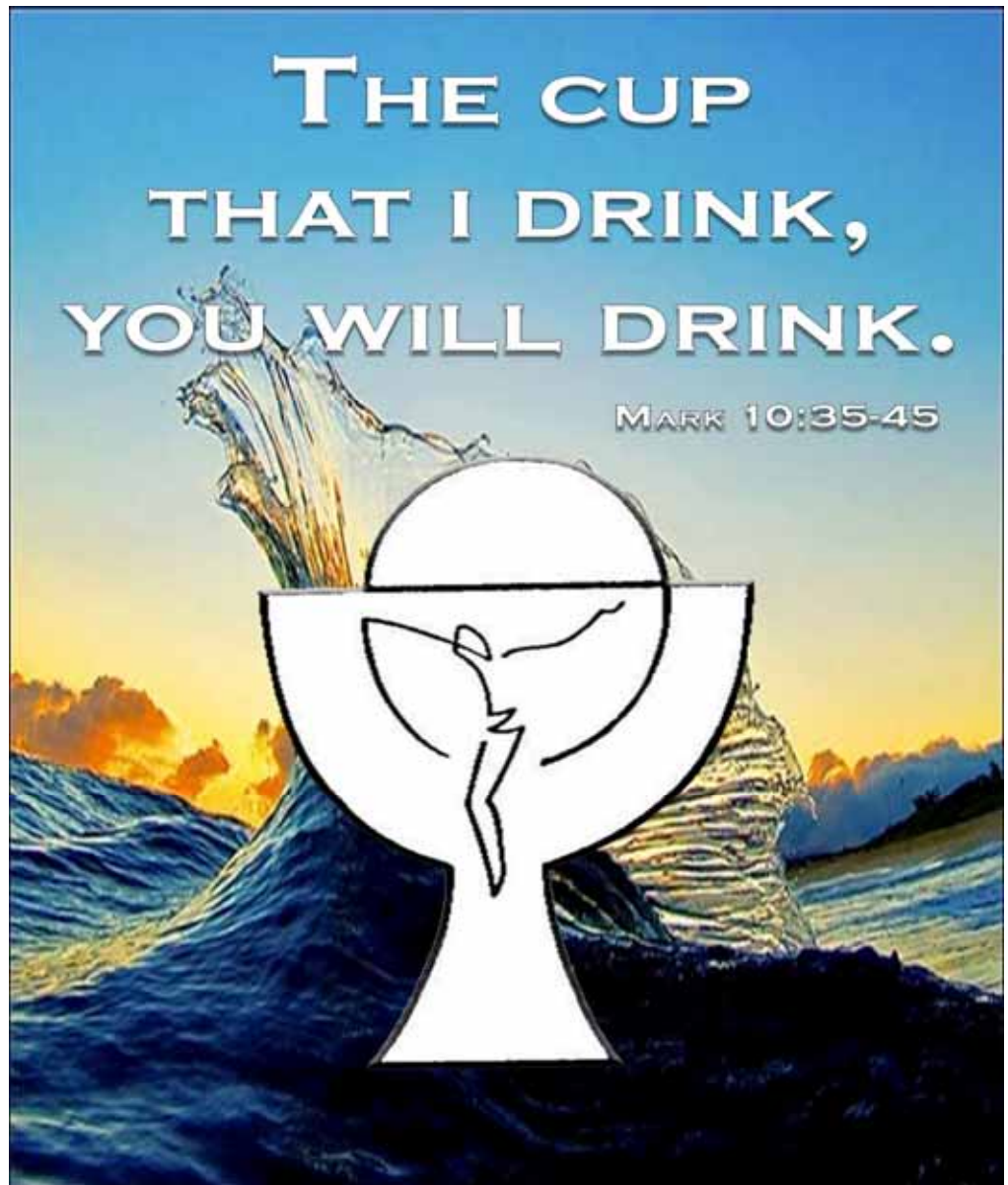

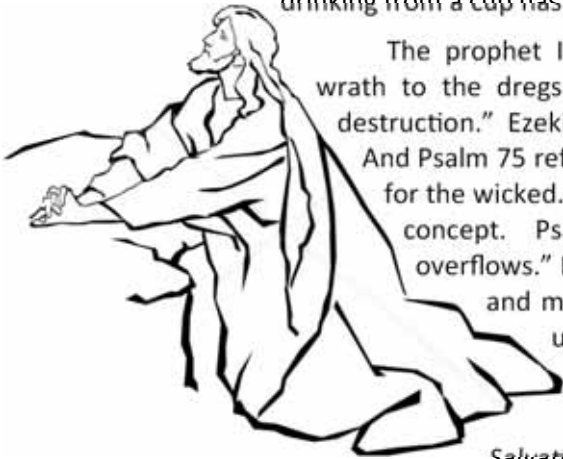




The Cup of Salvation

"Can you drink the cup that I drink?" That was the response of Christ to the Apostles James and John when they asked to sit on his right and his left when he entered into his glory. They replied, "We can." To which Christ added, "The cup that I drink you will drink."

That cup was again mentioned in the Garden of Gethsemane when Christ agonized over his immanent suffering, "Father, let this cup pass from me; yet not as I will but as you will." The cup was clearly a reference to his passion and death. But there is more. That cup is an important part of every Christian's life. The concept of drinking from a cup has deep scriptural roots.

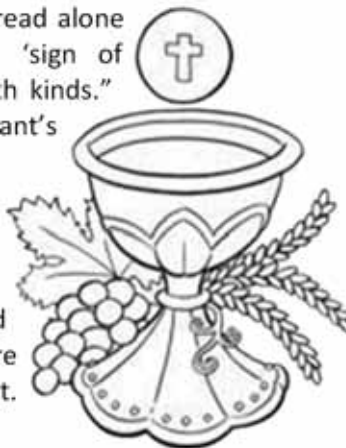


The prophet Isaiah spoke of drinking "the cup of wrath to the dregs." Jeremiah referred to "the cup of destruction." Ezekiel described "a cup of desolation." And Psalm 75 refers to "a cup of dregs" as punishment for the wicked. However, other psalms add a positive concept. Psalm 23 rejoices that, "My cup overflows." Psalm 16 says, "The Lord is my portion and my cup." Psalm 116 promises, "I will lift up the cup of salvation in thanksgiving."

The full meaning of the Cup of Salvation is not only hardship and suffering, but also joy and thanksgiving. The gospels use the same Greek word for the cup of suffering at the Garden of Gethsemane as for the cup of the Eucharist at the Last Supper. Our celebration of the death and resurrection of Christ is a saving grace: the cup of destruction becomes the cup of life.

In our Eucharistic celebration we are invited to receive the Body and Blood of Christ under the forms of both bread and wine. The Catechism of the Catholic Church observes: "Communion under the species of bread alone offers all the fruits of Eucharistic grace. But the 'sign of Communion' is more complete when given under both kinds." Communion itself is unchanged, but the communicant's participation is fuller under both forms.

Drinking from a cup is a sign of commitment; from the same cup, a sign of shared commitment. The Eucharistic cup is a pledge of union with Christ; drinking from the same cup as the other communicants, a shared pledge to the same faith in Christ. Catholics do more than receive the Eucharist; Catholics share the Eucharist. We share the Cup of Salvation.

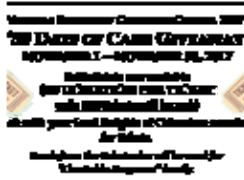
