This Wednesday, October 18, is the feast of St. Luke the Evangelist, author of the third gospel which bears his name. He is also the author of the Acts of the Apostles. The gospel of Luke is the longest (24 Chapters, 19,500 words) of the four canonical gospels and the Acts of the Apostles is also of considerable length (28 Chapters, 18,500 words), which makes Luke the author of almost one third of the New Testament. Luke is therefore a major force in our understanding of our Christian faith.

We have little historical information about the life of St. Luke. From his writings, it is clear that he was a highly educated Greek and tradition suggests that he was a physician and an artist. St. Luke is therefore the patron saint of artists, physicians, surgeons, and students. There are three references in the New Testament (Phlm, 1:24; Col 4:14; 2Tim 4:11) that he was an associate of St. Paul. His gospel and Acts of the Apostles are addressed to a certain *Theophilus*, a Greek name meaning "friend of God." It might also be a general term for all whom Luke deemed to be friends of God.

Luke's gospel, which we read during year C (we are currently in year A), is considered to be the finest literary writing in the New Testament. The gospel contains the canticles of Mary, Zachariah, and Simeon, as well as the *Gloria in Excelsis Deo* of the Angels, which are all poetic masterpieces. This gospel also gave us most of the parables, including the memorable Prodigal Son and Good Samaritan. The first two chapters of Luke, his *Infancy Narratives*, are used extensively in our liturgical celebration of the birth of Christ and also in popular literature during the Christmas season.

Because of his emphasis on certain themes, Luke's gospel has a number of nicknames: the gospel of women, the gospel of prayer, the gospel of the poor, the gospel of meals, and the gospel of life. The symbol for Luke's gospel is an ox since it begins and ends in the temple where the greatest sacrifice was that of an ox.



Luke's second volume, the *Acts of the Apostles*, a companion to his gospel, recounts the spread of Christianity immediately after the resurrection of Christ. While it is entitled the Acts of the Apostles, it is focused mainly on two apostles, Peter and Paul, the two who dominate the story and the life of the early church.

The prayer for the Mass of St. Luke reads: "Father, you chose Saint Luke the evangelist to reveal by preaching and writing the mystery of your love for the poor. Unite in our hearts and spirit all who glory in your name and let all nations come to your salvation through Christ our Lord. Amen."






