Labor Day Statement

National Conference of Catholic Bishops

Our Catholic social teachings hold that wages must be a just compensation for labor, sufficient for family stability and respect the dignity of the worker. Economic life is not meant solely to multiply goods and increase profit. It is directed first of all to the benefit of the whole person and the human community. The economy must serve people, not the other way around. Work is more than making a living; it is a form of participating in God's creation.

Recent economic reports are positive. Poverty continues to decline, unemployment is at the lowest level in decades, economic growth, production, stocks and profits have risen significantly. Although the median income has increased, it has been much less than that of the top earners. Taking into account the rising cost of living, workers at the lower end of the income spectrum have seen their real wages stagnate or even decrease over the last decade.

All of us can help build a stable economy that honors the dignity of each person. Employees must contribute by dedicated productive labor. While business owners need to assure profits for the long-term stability of their company, they also have an obligation to pay a fair wage which provides a dignified livelihood for workers and their families. A just wage not only provides for workers' financial well-being, but fosters their social, cultural, and spiritual life.

We are all called to live justly in our own lives whether as business

owners or employees. We are also called to stand in solidarity with the poor and vulnerable. Our work should build a more just society which promotes the dignity of each human life and thus assures the good of all. We also need to respect the gifts that God has entrusted to others as well as our own.

As Christians, we believe that

conflict and enmity between the rich and the poor are not necessary or inevitable. Any unjust division or mutual



resentment is in fact sinful. Our hope is that society can become ever more just through a conversion of heart and mind so that people recognize the inherent dignity of all and work together for the common good. May our celebration of Labor Day be an occasion to commit ourselves to social justice, to stand in solidarity with workers, to cooperate with management and to advocate full employment with fair wages. In so doing we can "bring glad tidings to the poor."

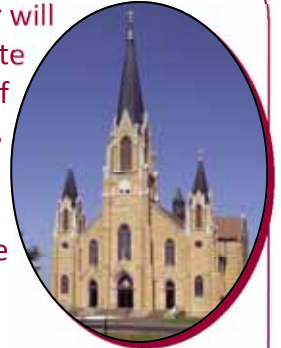
Mass At Holy Cross
