Knights of Columbus Free Throw Champions

Ten boys and girls from the Victoria area, ages 9 to 14, were named local champions of the 2017 Knights of Columbus Free Throw Championship and have earned the right to compete at the district level. St. Fidelis Council #1867 in Victoria sponsored the local competition at the Victoria High School Gymnasium on Sunday, January 29. All youngsters ages 9 to 14 (as of January 1st) were eligible to participate.

Nine-year-old champions were Jillian Schmidt in the girls' bracket and Brody Nowak in the boys'. Gracyn Schippers was the 10-year-old girls' champion and Wyatt Griffin was the winner of the 10-year-old boys' division. In the 11-year-olds' bracket, Greg Huser was the boys' champion. Twelve-year-old

winners in the girls' and boys' divisions were Jaci VonLintel and Thaddeus Wohler. The 13-year-old girls' division was won by Melany Huser and the boys' by Levi Huser. Fourteen-year-old boys' champion was Chase Schmidt.

Each contestant was allowed 15 free throw attempts in the contests. Ties were settled by successive rounds of five free throws per contestant until a winner emerged.

Each of these winners can compete in the district competition to be held on **Sunday, February 12**, at the Victoria High School Gymnasium with an eye toward moving on to the regional, state, and international levels.






