VETERANS DAY

Among the historic artifacts that can be found in the storage closets of area churches, actually displayed in the vestibule of one neighboring church, is *Die Stifftafel*, the pegboard. These handmade wooden peg boards showed the assignment of the pews rented to the various families of the parish.

Our senior parishioners will remember “pew rent.” In the days of the immigrant church the pews were auctioned off every year, not unlike season tickets at football stadiums. But unlike the stadium seats, the back pews went to the highest bidders while the front pews brought bleacher seat prices.

Such pew rent was a survival technique of the struggling immigrants and we should not judge their coping with hardship from our comfortable affluence. In one sense those immigrants were an image of the widow in today’s gospel who gave all that she had to the temple treasury. Magnificent churches and schools were built by immigrants who lived on the edge of poverty.

There is another aspect of the widow in this gospel that challenges us today. The widow in the gospel had two small coins. If she had just one coin, she could simply give it or keep it. But she had two coins and faced options. She could keep both. She could give one and keep the other. She gave both. It was not the total amount that was significant. It was the total giving.

The gospel says that in giving both she gave “her whole livelihood.” A caution is in order here. The story is not suggesting that needy widows give their necessary resources to charity or church. Stewardship is about responsible giving, not irresponsible grabbing. This gospel is about discerning priorities, deciding how to live. It is about almsgiving as an expression of a faith commitment. The widow’s gift was not about finances. It was about faith.

Many have cynical and distorted ideas about giving to charity and to church. Stewardship and tithing are a commitment to the message of the gospel and the mission of the church. We share in the finances of the church, because we share the faith of the church. The pew rent of the immigrants can convey a wrong notion that still lingers today: “It costs so much to run this place. I’ll pay my fair share.” Tithing is very different. Tithing say, “I give not that I can have a seat, but that there can be seats for everyone.”

The widow understood that she was only a steward of God’s many gifts. If we give as the widow in the gospel, we give because it isn’t really ours. Life and all that we have is a gift from God, gifts for which we are held accountable. We are stewards, not owners. One of the great paradoxes of Christian history is that this concept has been better understood and more faithfully practiced in times of hardship than in days of affluence.

“This poor widow gave more than all the others. They contributed from their surplus wealth. But she from her poverty, her whole livelihood.”


New Ministry to Elderly and Homebound


