“Repent,
for the
kingdom
of
heaven
is at hand.”

(from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew 4:12-23)



If Jesus of Nazareth were to return to earth today, what would he say? If he had a thirty second commercial during the Super Bowl what would be his message to our world? Most would suggest their favorite verse of scripture. "You shall love God with all your heart and your neighbor as yourself." Whatever you do to the least of my children that you do to me." "Forgive your enemies?" All good answers.

But not what scripture scholars tell us. The majority of scripture scholars think that if Jesus returned to earth he would repeat today's gospel and say, "Repent, for the kingdom of God is at hand."

If you are disappointed in that, some background may help. "Repent, for the kingdom of God is at hand" was the theme of the prophet Elijah, and of his successor, Elisha. It was the message of John the Baptist and Jesus. All of these prophets are known as prophets of the kingdom. They announced the coming of the kingdom of God.

If you are still disappointed, some analysis might help. "Repent, for the kingdom of God is at hand" has three concepts: repent – kingdom of God – at hand. A word on each.

Repent means much more than converting from a life of sin to a life of grace. It means continual growth in our faith and our commitment to our faith. Repent means conversion, and conversion is something that must happen every day. You cannot live today off the faith you had yesterday.

"Repent, for the kingdom of God is at hand." The **kingdom of God** may be the most difficult concept of the bible. It defies a complete definition. We know what it is **not**. It is **not** a geographical or social structure. The church is part of the kingdom of God but the church is **not** equivalent to the kingdom of God. The kingdom of God is wherever the power of God is acting in the world. The kingdom of God is what God wills the world to become. As we pray in the Lord's prayer, "Thy kingdom come."

"Repent, for the kingdom of God is **at hand**." Many view that as a warning, or even a threat. Fire and brimstone. The final words of that verse are crucial to a correct understanding. "**At hand**" is not a threat but a promise. It is not a deadline, but an opportunity.

The meaning of "at hand" is related to Christmas, to the incarnation. God has become one of us, he is near to us, he has shared our nature, which means that grace is offered now. Don't miss it. Grace is an opportunity. An old proverb says, "Opportunity knocks but once." "Repent, for the kingdom of God is at hand."

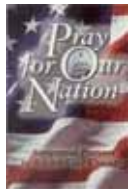
