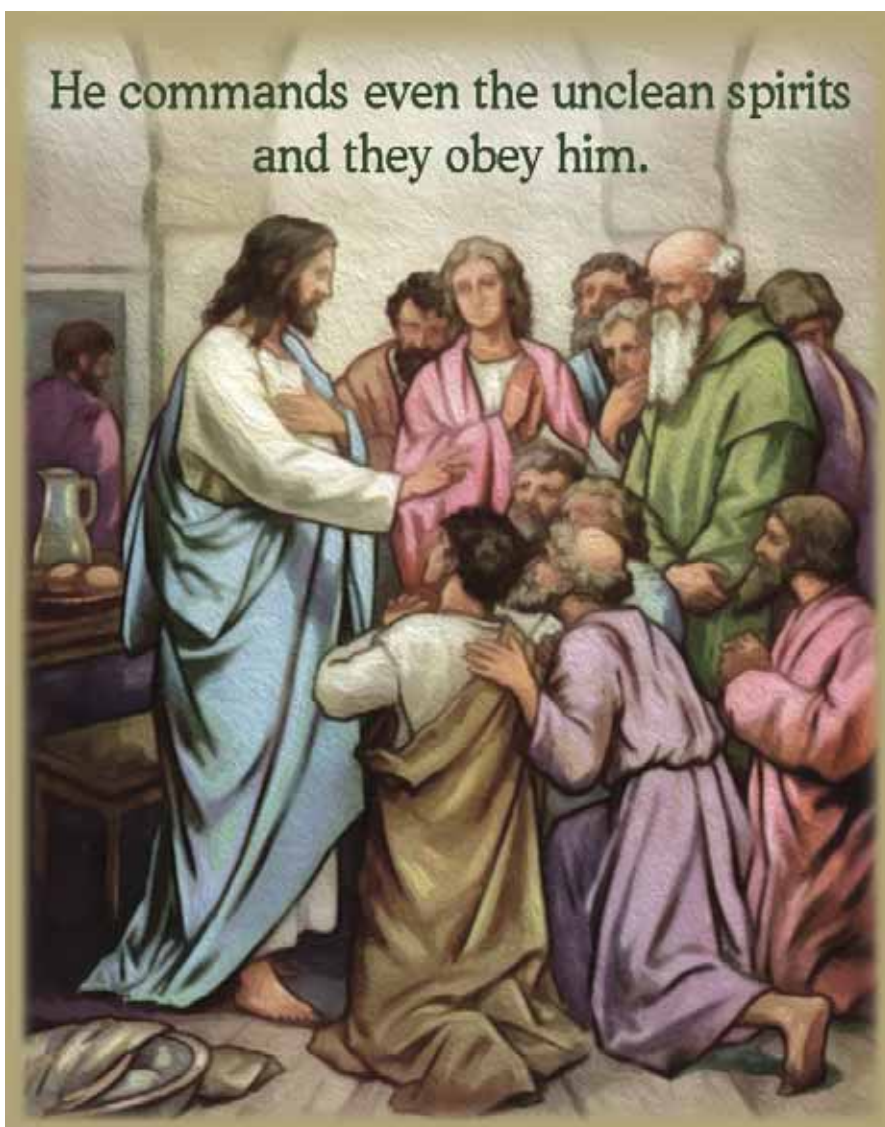

(from the Holy Gospel according to Mark 1:21-28)



In today's gospel Christ begins his public ministry by casting out a demon. The seven gospel narratives of Christ casting out a demon are the most frequent and the most significant of the miracles of Christ. The theme of his preaching was, "Repent, for the kingdom of God is at hand." Christ related that theme to his exorcisms in one of the most theological verses of the gospels, "If it is by the finger of God that I cast out demons, then the kingdom of God has come upon you." (Mt 12:28; Lk 11:20)

Many think of the Pharisees as the prime enemies of Christ. That was a minor skirmish. The fundamental opponent of Christ was the force for evil, personified in demons. The struggle with Satan begins with the temptations in the desert and continues throughout the gospels and culminates at his death on the cross.



Luke's account of the devil tempting Christ concludes, "the devil left him until an opportune time." That time came during Holy Week, when Luke notes the presence of Satan in Jerusalem three times. (Lk 22: 3, 31, 53) The betrayal of Judas is explained as, "Satan entered into him." (Lk 22:3) On the cross Christ faces again that temptation of Satan to throw himself down from the pinnacle of the temple. (Lk 4:9) "If you are the Son of God, save yourself and come down from the cross." (Mt 27:39; Mk 15:30)

The gospel accounts of the passion and death of Christ are primarily a confrontation with Satan. (Mk 14:38; Lk 22:53; John 14:30) Jesus' trust in God to defeat Satan is at the heart of what it means that he died to conquer sin. "Now is the time of judgment on the world, now the Prince of the world will be driven out." (Jn 12:31) The crucifixion of Christ reveals the Prince of this World as the enemy of goodness and truth and exposes the cruel evil of injustice. Easter is the vindication of Christ as the goodness of God which overcomes the evil of Satan.

Pope Francis frequently reminds us that the struggle of Christ with Satan is reflected in the life of every Christian. "Let us always remember that the devil wants to keep us separated from God. Every day the devil sows the seeds of pessimism and bitterness in our hearts. Let us open ourselves to the breath of the Holy Spirit, who never ceases to sow seeds of hope and confidence."

### Luther College Nordic Choir Performs Feb. 3 at St. Fidelis

Luther College Nordic Choir of Decorah, Iowa, one of the top college choirs in the nation, will perform at 7:30 p.m. **Saturday, February 3**, at the Basilica of St. Fidelis.

The performance by the 73-member Nordic Choir is open to the public. No admission will be charged, but a free-will offering will be taken to defray expenses of the tour.

The 2018 Nordic Choir tour program includes selections by Randall Thompson, Hans Leo Hassler, and others, including hymn-arrangements, spirituals, and the traditional Nordic Choir closing piece "O Lord God" by Pavel Chesnokov.

The concert is part of Nordic Choir's 2018 tour of the Midwest and Colorado. The choir tours annually and has performed around the world and throughout the United States. Nordic Choir enjoyed the tenure of Weston Noble as its conductor for 57 years. This tour marks the first year of the Nordic Choir under the baton of Dr. Andrew Last, Luther alumnus of 1997.

Luther is home to one of the largest collegiate music programs in the world with six choirs, three bands, three orchestras, two jazz bands, and numerous chamber ensembles, totaling more than 800 student musicians. Nearly 275 music majors study music theory/ear training, history, education, composition, church music, and performance.

**PLENARY INDULGENCE GIVEN WHEN VISITING A BASILICA**


The faithful may obtain a plenary indulgence by visiting a minor basilica. An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment for a previously forgiven sin. To obtain a plenary indulgence during a pilgrimage to a basilica, one must participate in any sacred rite or recite the Lord's Prayer or the profession of faith while there, then go to Confession and Communion and pray for the intention of the pope.
