I have baptized you with water; he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit.

(from the Holy Gospel according to Mark 1:7-11)



The Catholic Catechism says of the sacrament of baptism: "Baptism is the basis of the whole Christian life, the gateway to life in the Spirit, and the door which gives access to the other sacraments. Through Baptism we are freed from sin and reborn as children of God; we become members of Christ, are incorporated into the Church and made sharers in her mission: 'Baptism is the sacrament of regeneration through water in the word."

Of the baptism of Christ by John the Baptist the Catechism says: "Our Lord voluntarily submitted himself to the baptism of Saint John, intended for sinners, in order to 'fulfill all righteousness.' Jesus' gesture is a manifestation of his selfemptying. The Spirit who had hovered over the waters of the first creation descended then on the Christ as a prelude of the new creation, and the Father revealed Jesus as his 'beloved Son.'

"Christ spoke of his Passion and Death as a 'Baptism' with which he had to be baptized. The blood and water that flowed from the pierced side of the crucified Jesus are types of Baptism and the Eucharist, the sacraments of new life. From then on, it is possible 'to be born of water and the Spirit' in order to enter the Kingdom of God."

From these statements of the Catechism we learn that the baptism of Christ by John and our Sacrament of baptism are related but not the same. We will never understand today's feast of the Baptism of the Lord if we equate his baptism by John with out own sacramental baptism. The sinless Christ had no need of such a baptism.

To understand today's feast one must first understand the nature of John's baptism. The baptism that John offered was not the Christian sacramental baptism which you have received. It was a pledge to improve one's life by living closer to God. If we have a similar ritual today, it would be receiving ashes on Ash Wednesday.

The baptism of Christ by John did not free Christ of any sin, yet it is related to our sinful condition. At the baptism of Christ the voice of God the Father proclaims, "This is my beloved Son." That is at the heart of the meaning of the baptism of Christ. Jesus is the Son of God, sent by the Father on a mission of salvation. His baptism is the public proclamation that Jesus has been anointed by the Father as Messiah to save the people from their sins.

Christ assumed our human nature to identify with sinful humanity that he might redeem us by his death and resurrection which offer us a new life in God. Jesus, burdened with the sins of all mankind, went into the waters of the Jordan to inaugurate his public ministry by stepping into the place of sinners to redeem them.

We celebrate the Baptism of the Lord because it is a promise of our salvation through the Paschal Mystery, the death and resurrection of Christ, the central mystery of our faith.

PLENARY INDULGENCE GIVEN WHEN VISITING A BASILICA


