## The Glass Ceiling

Mary broke the “glass ceiling.” That is the explanation of Tuesday’s feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary by Susan Muto who writes on the spirituality of women. “The glass ceiling” is used by the women’s movement to express an invisible barrier to a legitimate goal. This usually refers to professional inequalities for women.



Susan Muto applies this image to achieving salvation as exemplified by Mary’s Assumption. Mary was the first to break the invisible barrier to salvation. We know that we were made for union with God, here as well as hereafter.

Yet such union with God is difficult to achieve as we experience many obstacles to our salvation. There is a barrier, a glass ceiling, preventing us from our Christian ideal. The feast of the Assumption of Mary honors one who has actually achieved Christian perfection and eternal glory. That is the sense in which Mary broke *the glass ceiling* for all Christians.

Pope Pius XII proclaimed the doctrine of the Assumption in 1950. *“Since Mary completely overcame sin by the unique privilege of her Immaculate Conception and a sinless life, she was not subject to the corruption of the grave which is a consequence of sin. She did not have to wait until the end of time for the redemption of her body.”*

This fullness of Christ’s victory over sin and death will not be granted to us until the resurrection of the just at the end of time. Mary who was the first and perfect disciple of Christ was rightly the first to share fully in his victory over sin and death. When she was taken into heaven, *body and soul*, at the moment of her death, she broke *the glass ceiling*.

This *glass ceiling* of salvation, the invisible barrier to salvation, is the evil of sin. It was her sinlessness that entitled Mary to the glory of the Assumption. Mary Immaculate, Mary free of all sin, broke *the glass ceiling* of sin to show us the way to salvation.

This image of sin as the glass ceiling has a timely message. The nature of a glass ceiling is that we cannot see the barrier. Sin is often invisible in our age. It is very much a reality, but too often we do not see it. We seldom use the word sin. We call it by other names: addiction, psychosis, weakness, stress. When the noted English journalist G. K. Chesterton converted to Catholicism, he was frequently asked why he had joined the Catholic Church. Chesterton’s quick reply was, “To get rid of my sins.”

More than anything else it is our sins which keep us from being happy in this life and unworthy of life eternal. Our failure to see our sins is the glass ceiling of our salvation. The Assumption of Mary, in which she broke that glass ceiling, is a promise that we can reach eternal glory and we can have a fuller life here . . . if we repent of our sins.

The Safety Coordinator of your parish has a thorough understanding of Safe Environment Policies and procedures and takes care of all the record keeping, reporting, and communicating the importance of a safe environment and models behaviors that support the *Promise to Protect, Pledge to Heal*.

If you currently work or volunteer with minors at your parish or school your Safety Coordinator has your Safe Environment training records.

If you are **NEW** to the Parish or school or you need to **UPDATE** (if it has been over 5 years since your last training/background check) and you want to work or volunteer with minors or continue to work or volunteer with minors at the parish or school, please contact Jeanette Brungardt so she can get you started/updated with the Safe Environment Training for our Diocese.

The Safety Coordinator will oversee your training, answer any questions you may have and make sure your training is properly recorded.

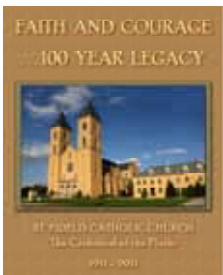
