Today is the second Sunday of Lent and the gospel reading is Matthew's account of the Transfiguration of Christ. Many wonder what the glorious Transfiguration has to do with penance of Lent. The gospel on the first Sunday of Lent is always the temptations of Christ. That makes sense. Lent is a time to face our weaknesses. On the Second Sunday of Lent, the gospel is always the Transfiguration. That is not an obvious Lenten theme. It may seem more an Easter message of glory.

Today's gospel passage must be read in its context to appreciate its full meaning and its Lenten message. The account of the Transfiguration is linked to Peter's misunderstanding of the nature of the Messiah. In the gospel passage before the story of the Transfiguration Christ admonishes St. Peter: "The Son of Man must suffer greatly, be rejected by the elders, be killed, and on the third day be raised." Then immediately following the transfiguration, Christ repeats this prediction. The transfiguration is sandwiched between two predictions of his passion to set the transfiguration in the context of the death and resurrection of Christ.

The Apostles who witnessed the transfiguration—Peter, James, and John—are also significant. The same three apostles witnessed the agony in the garden of Gethsemane. At Gethsemane the apostles overslept; at the transfiguration they were overwhelmed. They missed the message both times. The two predictions of his passion, and the three Apostles present, set the transfiguration in the context of the death and resurrection of Christ.

The gospels for these first two Sundays of Lent are one unit focusing on the essence of Lent: turn away from sin, that you may know the glory of God. The temptations of Christ—turn away from sin; The Transfiguration—behold the glory of God.

These two Lenten gospels remind us that the penance of Lent is linked to the promise of Easter. Whatever you are doing for Lent, or denying yourself for Lent, should renew your faith. Many are tempted to the paradox of doing something for Lent to dismiss Lent: "I'm giving up desserts for Lent and that takes care of Lent." No, it does not. Such an attitude gives up on Lent as a time to renew one's faith. The three practices of Lent—prayer, fasting, and almsgiving—are an integral unit. No one can stand alone.

Christ was transfigured to encourage the confused apostles who were dismayed that the Messiah must suffer, die, and rise. The Transfiguration should assure us that our Lenten observance can give new life to our faith. The transfiguration of Christ is proclaimed each Lent in the context of his death and resurrection in the hope that our Lenten observance will transfigure our faith.

Injured Community College Track Team Member to Speak to Students

All students in grades K-12 are invited to the closing service of the Wednesday night Religious Ed classes on Wednesday, April 30, at 7:30 p.m. in St. Fidelis Church. The closing services will include guest speaker Chase Kear from Colwich, KS. Kear, a member of the 2008 Hutchinson Community College track team, fell during pole vaulting practice in October 2008. The fall resulted in a severe head injury. The doctors who attended to Chase told his parents that there wasn't much hope for survival.

Within hours of the accident, family and friends of Chase joined in prayer to Kansas native, Father Emil Kapaun, a Korean War hero. Fr. Kapaun is currently being considered for sainthood in the Catholic Church. Chase will share his personal story of his recovery which many believe to be the miraculous result of the intercession of Fr. Kapaun.

“The Cathedral of the Plains”

has been declared a minor basilica by Pope Francis.

Save the date of Saturday, June 7, for a celebration of this honor.
There will be a morning Mass and a noon luncheon that day.

What is a Basilica?

Beginning in the 18th century, a church only could be named a minor basilica by the pope. Before then, some churches that were designed in a particular style were generally called basilicas although never granted that title by the pontiff.

There are only four major (“greater”) basilicas: St. Peter’s Basilica in Vatican City and the Basilica of St. John Lateran, Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls and Basilica of St. Mary Major, all in Rome.

There are more than 1,600 minor basilicas worldwide, but only 78 in the United States, including the newest in Victoria. In the last several years, anywhere from two to four churches in the United States have been designated a minor basilica.

The others closest to the Diocese of Salina are the Basilica of the Immaculate Conception at Conception Abbey in Conception, Mo., which was designated a minor basilica in 1940, and the Cathedral Basilica of the Immaculate Conception in Denver, designated in 1979. The first named basilica in the United States was the Basilica of St. Mary in Minneapolis, Minn., in 1926.

The title of minor basilica is granted to churches that have been found to have particular importance for liturgical and pastoral life, according to the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops.

The diocese’s bishop must initiate the request through the U.S. bishop’s conference, which, if approved,

is forwarded to the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments at the Vatican.

The cathedral holds first place and the greatest dignity in a diocese, but a minor basilica stands out as a center of active and pastoral liturgy and typically has historic, architectural, and artistic importance.

Once named a minor basilica, the church is expected to carry out liturgical celebrations with great care, particularly the seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter, and also on three dates: the Feast of the Chair of St. Peter the Apostle, on February 22, the Solemnity of SS. Peter and Paul, Apostles, on June 29, and the anniversary of the pope’s election or installation. Pope Francis was elected on March 13 and installed on March 19.

The faithful may obtain a plenary indulgence by visiting a minor basilica and participate in any sacred rite or recite the Lord’s Prayer or the profession of faith. They also must go to Confession and Communion and pray for the intention of the pope. They may choose any day to visit the basilica or select the anniversary of the granting of the title or the dedication of the basilica, the date of the liturgical celebration of the granting of the title, the Solemnity of SS. Peter and Paul, or a specific date to be determined by the bishop.

A minor basilica may display the papal symbol of “crossed keys” on banners or furnishings and on the seal of the basilica.

B e w a r e o f S c a m s

You all have probably heard of or read about the many different types of phone, letter, or email scams that have been making their way around the country.

Even in our area, residents are receiving calls from suspicious people wanting personal information in return for a product or service that does not exist. They then use the information given them to steal your identity so they can make purchases or perform other illegal activities using your name and information.

Some scams involve a sob story about a relative stuck in a distant place who needs your financial help.

Be aware that you should never give out your Social Security number or other personal information to unsolicited callers. Do not send money to callers without checking the legitimacy of their sob stories. Do not click on links in emails unless you know the sender of the email. Remember, hackers can make it look like an email comes from someone you know even when it doesn’t. Emails that ask you to verify your password are probably always scams.

Just be very careful and check things out thoroughly before giving out your personal information.






