(from the Holy Gospel according to Mark 9:2-10)



Yogi Berra said famously, "If you come to a fork in the road, take it!" Today's gospel is a fork in the road at the midpoint of Mark's gospel. There are sixteen chapters in Mark. Today we begin chapter nine, which takes a turn in his gospel. It turns toward the cross.

That may sound surprising, because this gospel story is about the Transfiguration, a manifestation of glory. It surprises many that this gospel is read during Lent. It sounds more like a gospel for the Easter season. Yet every year the gospel for the Second Sunday of Lent is the Transfiguration. The gospel for the first Sunday of Lent is always Christ tempted by the devil. The second Sunday is always Christ transfigured. What has the Transfiguration to do with Lent and the Cross?

In each gospel the Transfiguration is set between two predictions of the death and resurrection of Christ. In the gospel of Mark the story of the Transfiguration is placed between the first and second of three predictions of his death and resurrection. The unedited first verse of today's gospel reads, "Six days after he had said this, He took Peter, James, and John up on the mountain." Six days after he had said what? After he had predicted his death and resurrection.

His disciples were dumfounded at that prediction. This was a fork in the road not only for the gospel story but also a fork in the road for the disciples. They wanted to take the other path, the easier path, the wrong path. The gospel says, "They kept questioning what rising from the dead meant." It was a mystery beyond their comprehension.

The transfiguration was intended to reveal not simply the divine glory of Christ, but the deeper mystery of his death and resurrection, the Paschal Mystery. Yet even after the Transfiguration, the gospel says that the apostles ". . . kept questioning what rising from the dead might mean." With hindsight, with the advantage of knowing the full gospel, that mystery is much easier for us, than for the apostles.

During Lent we are reminded that our own Christian life is often an encounter with a fork in the road. We are confronted with choices. And we are lured down paths and avenues that are alien to Christian values. Lent reminds us that the way to a fuller Christian life is often the more demanding road.

Today's gospel message for us, as it was for the Apostles, is found in the full context of the Transfiguration. That full context is that the glory of Christ is related to his suffering and death and that his followers can expect the same in their own journey. If you come to a fork in the road of your Christian life, the road to glory will have a cross along it. When you come to that fork in the road . . . take it.





You are welcome to keep your original copy (there were printing errors but the history information is still all in it) or you may bring it back in and we will try to sell it.


Thank you for all your patience with the process of getting this book completed.
