We continue with excerpts from 'Laudato Si" where the Pope presents the scientific consensus on climate change and other threats to the environment, especially the water supplies and biodiversity. He also looks at how environmental degradation has affected human life and society and the global inequality of the environmental crisis.

30. Even as the quality of available water is constantly diminishing, there is a growing tendency to turn it into a commodity subject to the laws of the market. Yet access to safe drinkable water is a basic and universal human right, since it is essential to human survival and, as such, is a condition for the exercise of other human rights. Our world has a grave social debt towards the poor who lack access to drinking water, because they are denied the right to a life consistent with their inalienable dignity. This debt can be paid partly by an increase in funding to provide clean water and sanitary services among the poor. But water continues to be wasted, in the developed world and also in developing countries which possess it in abundance. This shows that there is little awareness of the seriousness of such behavior within a context of great inequality.

Lost Beauty of Nature

- 33. It is not enough to think of different species merely as "resources" to be exploited, while overlooking the value in themselves. Each year sees the disappearance of plant and animal species which we will never know, which our children will never see, and will no longer give glory to God by their very existence, nor convey their message to us.. The great majority become extinct for reasons related to human activity.
- 34. A sober look at our world shows that human intervention, often in the service of business and consumerism, is actually making our earth less rich and beautiful, even as technological advances and consumer goods continue to abound. We seem to think that we can substitute an irreplaceable beauty with something which we have created.

The Digital Information Overload

47. Furthermore, when media and the digital world become omnipresent, their influence can stop people from learning how to live wisely, to think deeply and to love generously amid the noise and distractions of an information overload. True wisdom, as the fruit of self-examination, dialogue and generous encounter between persons, is not acquired by a mere accumulation of data which eventually leads to overload and confusion, a sort of mental pollution. Real relationships with others, with all the challenges they entail, now tend to be replaced by a type of internet communication which enables us to choose or eliminate relationships at whim, thus giving rise to a new type of contrived emotion which has more to do with devices and displays than with other people and with nature. Today's media do enable us to communicate and to share our knowledge and affections. Yet at times they also shield us from direct contact with the pain, the fears and the joys of others and the complexity of personal experiences. Along with the exciting possibilities offered by these media, a deep and melancholic dissatisfaction with interpersonal relations, or a harmful sense of isolation, can also arise.

Next week we continue with the dimensions that the Christian faith brings to our relationship with the natural environment.
