Luke 1:1-4; 4:14-21



The Gospel of Luke



Today's gospel reading is the beginning of the gospel of Luke. This is year C of the liturgical cycle during which we read primarily from the gospel of Luke. Each of the four gospels has a symbol, taken from Ezekiel (1:10) and Revelation (4:7), which conveys the tenor of that gospel as indicated in its opening. The symbol for Luke is the ox, since his gospel begins and ends in the temple where the major sacrifice was an ox or a bull.

The evangelist Luke was a well educated Greek, a skilled writer who knew the Hebrew Scriptures. He was probably a convert to Judaism before becoming a Christian. Tradition holds that he was a physician and a painter as is evidenced in the literary details of his writing.

Luke is the longest of the gospels. He also wrote the Acts of the Apostles. Those two books, which comprise almost one third of the New Testament, are a magnificent blending of the story of Jesus and that of the early church.

The gospel of Luke has many nicknames. It is known as the *Gospel of Mary* since it features her prominently in the birth and infancy of Jesus. Luke is also known as the *Gospel of Women* since it treats women more often and more favorably than the other evangelists. This is evident not only with the mother of Jesus, but also the sisters of Lazarus, Martha and Mary, Mary Magdalene, as well as the women in his many parables.



Luke's gospel is also called the *Gospel of Prayer*. It offers us the four great canticles: *the Benedictus*, *the Magnificat*, *the Nunc Dimittis*, and *the Gloria in Excelsis*. Jesus is found praying more often in Luke than in the other gospels.

The *Gospel of the Poor* is another title for Luke's gospel. The poor, the outcast, the lowly are favored by the Lord in this gospel: the shepherds, the lepers, the beggars, and the sick. Luke is also the *Gospel of Parables* since it has the most

parables, ten of them unique to his gospel. The best known parables are from Luke: the Good Samaritan and the Prodigal Son.

Familiar gospel stories of forgiveness and compassion in Luke have merited his work also the title of the *Gospel of Mercy*. Such narratives include the sinful woman who washed the feet of Jesus, Zacchaeus the tax collector, and especially the good thief on Calvary.

This coming year the gospel readings from Luke will offer encouragement and hope to we fragile Christians.

PLENARY INDULGENCE GIVEN WHEN VISITING A BASILICA

The faithful may obtain a plenary indulgence by visiting a minor basilica. An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment for a previously forgiven sin. To obtain a plenary indulgence during a pilgrimage to a basilica, one must participate in any sacred rite or recite the Lord's Prayer or the profession of faith while there, then go to Confession and Communion and pray for the intention of the pope.
