

If you experience nostalgia for Latin at Mass, this third Sunday of Advent offers a taste of that Latin and a bond with our great Catholic heritage. Today is known traditionally as *Gaudete Sunday*.

That tradition comes from the entrance antiphon of today's Mass which begins in the Latin with *Gaudete*, meaning "Rejoice." "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice! The Lord is near." (Phil 4:4-5) That verse sets the tone of joyful expectation for the Lord's birth and also for his Second Coming. In the spirit of joy rose-colored vestments are permitted today in place of the Advent purple.

This Advent tradition has a parallel during Lent. The Fourth Sunday of Lent is known as *Laetare* Sunday. *Laetare* also means rejoice and is likewise taken from the opening antiphon of that Sunday's Mass (Is 66:10-11). Rose-colored vestments are again permitted.

A comparison with Lent's *Laetare* Sunday helps to clarify the message of *Gaudete* Sunday. Our present holiday season is filled with a spirit of good will, and "Rejoice" is an expected theme. But the middle of Lent has no such elation, and we are forced to look beyond the social setting to the positive message of Lent which is a celebration of our redemption through the death and resurrection of Christ, the Paschal Mystery.

Laetare Sunday of Lent, and Gaudete Sunday of Advent both rejoice in the promise of our Salvation: during Lent the sober joy of the death and resurrection of Christ; in Advent the radiant joy of the birth of Christ and his Second coming.

The joy proclaimed this third Sunday of Advent is not that of a jolly Santa but the joy of salvation, a promise realized in the birth of the Christ Child. The prophet Isaiah wrote, "Behold a virgin will conceive and bear a son and they will call him Emmanuel, which means 'God is with us.' " (Is 54:3) We rejoice in this Advent season, as we do in Lent, that God is with us. He is with us through His Son who became one of us and redeemed us through his life, death, and resurrection.

Advent joy is not only about the birth of Christ but also about His Second Coming. Many Advent readings are about preparing for the final days at the end of time because Advent is not only about the birth of Christ in Bethlehem but also His Second Coming at the end of time.

The Advent focus on the final coming of Christ at the end of time is integral to our faith. At Mass we respond to The Mystery of Faith, with "We proclaim your death, O Lord, and profess your Resurrection, until you come again." The final coming of Christ at the end of time will be the fulfillment of His first coming at Bethlehem, the eternal meaning of Christmas. Only then will the promise and the joy be complete. *Gaudete*.

Retreat Opportunity for Men




