World Day for Consecrated Life **Boy Scout Sunday** Super Bowl Sunday **Groundhog Day**



When the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses, Mary and Joseph took

Jesus up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord, just as it is written in the law of the Lord.



As a small child your mother taught you a traditional night prayer:

Now I lay me down to sleep I pray the Lord my soul to keep. If I should die before I wake. I pray the Lord my soul to take.

A nice prayer. For children. Where is there a night prayer for adults? Night prayer in the Liturgy of the Hours, the official prayer of the church, is called *Compline*. Today's gospel records the Canticle of Simeon which is the high point of *Compline*. Simeon's canticle is known as the Nunc Dimittis from its opening words in the Latin text.

Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in the sight of all the peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel.

This Canticle of the prophet Simeon is a prayer of grateful resignation to God's will on the occasion of an ending or a transition. It expresses a peace of acceptance and a joy of completion, not so much because I have completed my task, but because God has completed his work and fulfilled his promise in my life.

The Nunc Dimittis is not entirely original with Simeon. It is a mosaic of verses taken from the prophet Isaiah, i.e. "seeing salvation," "in the sight of all the peoples," "a light to the gentiles," "glory for Israel." (Is 52:9-10, 49:6, 46:13, 42:6, 40:5). As any mosaic, it uses pieces from another source to create an original beauty of its own.

There are three doublets in this Canticle: *a)* dismissal in peace, *b)* for God has kept his word; *a)* having seen the salvation, *b)* prepared in the sight of all the peoples; *a)* light to the Gentiles, *b)* the glory of Israel.

This canticle offers a view of salvation which spans both the Old Testament and the New Testament. The salvation spoken of is rooted in God's chosen people, Israel, but this salvation is a light to the gentiles, who are now included in God's people. This message is the same as that of the Epiphany and of the development of Christianity in the Acts of the Apostles.

The Nunc Dimittis is a scriptural night prayer to enrich the faith of adult Christians.

Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in the sight of all the peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel.

The Scouts started registering members in 1913,

asking a 25 cent yearly fee. Within 12 years, in 1925, their membership grew to over one million, and by 2000 the organization reached its 100 millionth registered member.

Perhaps because younger brothers were seeing older brothers enjoying Scouting, a Cub Scout program was begun in 1930.

Pennsylvania's earliest settlers were Germans. They found groundhogs there that to them resembled the European hedgehog. And so the tradition continued.

The Punxutawney Groundhog Club in Punxutawney, Pennsylvania, keeps the legend alive by annually celebrating the appearance on February 2nd of the groundhog Punxutawney Phil.
