“Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again; but whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst; the water I shall give will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life.”



(from the Holy Gospel according to John 4:5-42)



Comedian Bill Cosby has a routine about the various names by which his mother called him. When she cooed, "Dear," things were rosy; when she said "Bill," things were normal; when she called him "William," things were serious; but when she said firmly, "William Henry," he knew he was in big trouble.

Today's gospel shows the process of the conversion of the Samaritan woman by the names with which she refers to Christ.

Resenting the harsh treatment of Samaritan women by Jews, she rebuffs Jesus' request for a drink, "How can you, a **Jew**, ask me a Samaritan women, for a drink?" Jesus did not enter into that useless debate, but instead offers her something positive, "living water." She misunderstood that as water more abundant than Jacob's well. But Jesus insists on his spiritual meaning, water that springs up to eternal life to end spiritual thirst. She is disarmed by his courtesy and responds, "**Sir**, give me this water." Having established a polite discourse, Jesus introduces a moral issue, her husband. When her evasive reply is exposed by Jesus, she concedes, "I can see that you are a **prophet**."

Although he now has the upper hand in the discussion, Jesus does not dismiss her but continues to invite her to faith. When she raises the theological dispute between the Jews and Samaritans regarding the site of worship Jesus refuses to engage in a futile argument. Although he insists that salvation is from the Jews, he explains that the place of worship is of less concern than "worshiping the Father in Spirit and truth."

The woman acknowledges this, "I know that the Messiah is coming, the one called the Christ." Then Jesus plays his trump card, "I am he." Her conversion is complete when she accepts this and invites others, "Come see a man who told me everything I have done. Could he possibly be **the Christ**?"

Her movement from disbelief to faith can be traced in the terms she uses to address Jesus. With a Samaritan's disdain she first refers to him as, "**A Jew**." When she gains human respect for him she addresses him as "**Sir**." Then she realizes that he is a "**prophet**," and finally she refers to him as "**the Christ**."

This gospel of the Samaritan woman is Lent in a nutshell. When the Lord confronts her at the well about her life, was her Ash Wednesday. Reluctantly she admits her sins. She goes to confession. She is absolved. And the focus of her life is changed. "I know the Messiah is coming, the one called the Christ." She leaves her water jar, her former way of life, behind, and she joyfully proclaims that the promised Messiah has come. That was her Easter Sunday. May our Lenten journey lead to the same joyful faith.

The Wooden Bowl

A frail old man went to live with his son, daughter-in-law, and four-year-old grandson.

The old man's hands trembled, his eyesight was blurred, and his step faltered.

The family ate together at the table. But the elderly grandfather's shaky hands and failing sight made eating difficult. Peas rolled off his spoon onto the floor. When he grasped the glass, milk spilled on the tablecloth. The son and daughter-in-law became irritated with the mess.

"We must do something about father," said the son. "I've had enough of his spilled milk, noisy eating, and food on the floor."

So the husband and wife set a small table in the corner. There, Grandfather ate alone while the rest of the family enjoyed dinner. Since Grandfather had broken a dish or two, his food was served in a wooden bowl.

When the family glanced in Grandfather's direction, sometimes he had a tear in his eye as he sat alone. Still, the

only words the couple had for him were sharp admonitions when he dropped a fork or spilled food.

The four-year-old watched it all in silence. One evening before supper, the father noticed his son playing with wood scraps on the floor. He asked the child sweetly, "What are you making?"

Just as sweetly, the boy responded, "Oh, I am making a little bowl for you and Mama to eat your food in when I grow up."

The four-year-old smiled and went back to work.

The words so struck the parents that they were speechless. Then tears started to stream down their cheeks. That evening the husband took Grandfather's hand and gently led him back to the family table. For the remainder of his days he ate every meal with the family. And for some reason, neither husband nor wife seemed to care any longer when a fork was dropped, milk spilled, or the tablecloth soiled.

Injured Community College Track Team Member to Speak to Students

All students in grades K-12 are invited to the closing service of the Wednesday night Religious Ed classes on Wednesday, April 30, at 7:30 p.m. in St. Fidelis Church. The closing services will include guest speaker Chase Kear from Colwich, KS. Kear, a member of the 2008 Hutchinson Community College track team, fell during pole vaulting practice in October 2008. The fall resulted in a severe head injury. The doctors who attended to Chase told his parents that there wasn't much hope for survival.

Within hours of the accident, family and friends of Chase joined in prayer to Kansas native, Father Emil Kapaun, a Korean War hero. Fr. Kapaun is currently being considered for sainthood in the Catholic Church. Chase will share his personal story of his recovery which many believe to be the miraculous result of the intercession of Fr. Kapaun.




