(from the Holy Gospel according to John 9:1-41)



Christianity loves a paradox. Today's gospel offers this paradox: the blind see while the sighted are blind. The blind man can see what the sighted Pharisees cannot see. Many people can look at the same image or view the same event and see something entirely different. There are different kinds of sight beyond physical vision.

In today's gospel the man born blind is the only one who sees with the eyes of faith. The disciples, the Pharisees, and the parents of the beggar are all blind to the message of Christ. Only the blind man sees. When Christ gives sight to the blind in gospel miracles he also gives the vision of faith. Today's gospel contrasts the lack of faith of those who are sighted, with the faith of the man born blind. He is the only one who sees.

The disciples are blind. They ask, "Whose sin was it that he was born blind?" The problem of evil blinded them to the goodness of God. The Pharisees are blind. "This man cannot be from God for he does not observe the Sabbath." They cannot see that a legalistic observance of the Sabbath blinded them to the greater law of charity. The parents of the beggar are blind. "He is old enough to speak for himself." They were blind to the loyalty due their son, and also to the message of Christ. The blind man alone sees the truth of faith in Christ and is able to say, "I do believe."

In Lent we are asked to face our failures honestly. Too often we have an eagle eye to spot the faults of others, yet we are blind to our own sins. Like the disciples, the tragedies of life can blind us to the goodness of God. Christian faith sees unavoidable human suffering, not as empty misery, but as a share in the suffering, death, and resurrection of Christ. The vision of faith can bring the light of hope to human suffering.

Like the Pharisees, we can be blind to the truths of our own faith. The Catholic Faith is a commitment to an integral unit. Half measures or multiple choices are not found in the gospels. Lent is a time to check for blind spots in our faith.

And like the parents of the beggar, we can be blind to those who need us. By Lenten penance we deny ourselves that we might experience want and be moved to share with those in need.

The man born blind received both physical sight and the vision of faith as he professed, "I do believe." Christ said, "I came into this world to divide it, to make the sightless see and the seeing blind." Today's gospel is asking us, "What are you seeing this Lent and to what are you still blind?"

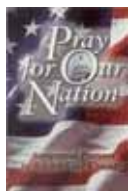
