FRIARS' MIND

This weekend we celebrated a very fundamental truth of our faith in the twin feasts of All Saints Day and All Souls Day. These two feasts are celebrated together because they are two parts of one mystery. All the Souls who die in Christ become All the Saints in heaven. On All Souls Day, we celebrate our belief that the faithful departed will rise to eternal life and that there is a bond between them and us. The saints in heaven, the souls in purgatory, and the faithful on earth form one community in faith, the Communion of Saints.

In 1968 Pope Paul VI wrote the Creed of the People of God in which he explained the elements of the Nicene Creed which we recited each Sunday. Regarding the Communion of Saints he wrote, "We believe in the communion of all the faithful of Christ, those who are pilgrims on earth, the dead who are being purified, and the blessed in heaven, all together forming one Church; and we believe that in this communion the merciful love of God and His saints is ever listening to our prayers."

Our age values the significance of relationships. The Communion of Saints is the deepest and most enduring of all personal relationships. It is the life of grace which we share with each other in the church here on earth, with the departed in purgatory, and with the saints in glory.

Any healthy relationship is mutually enriching. That is eminently true of the Communion of Saints. When we share our faith with others here on earth, it enriches our own faith. Our prayers for those who have gone before us not only benefit them, but also win for us their intercession.

G. K. Chesterton wrote that "Tradition is the democracy of the dead." Those words remind us that the values of our life continue to be formed by those who have gone before us. It is often said that the nobility of a society can be judged by the manner in which it honors its dead. Our Catholic faith is known both for its respect of tradition and its prayerful remembrance of the dead.

The immigrants who brought Catholicism to this area expressed this faith in very practical ways: the magnificent churches they built, the schools they founded, offering Masses for the departed, and their respect for cemeteries.

Even Yogi Berra offered one of his enigmatic thoughts on remembering the departed. In his patented mysterious vocabulary Yogi said, "If you don't go to other peoples funerals, they won't come to yours." As with many of his sayings, there is a hidden wisdom in his humorous twist of words. We too will have a journey after this life, and we would hope to have the support of our friends as we travel that unknown path.

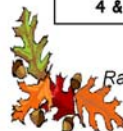
