PREISTHOOD SUNDAY

“You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.”

(from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew 22:34-40)



G. K. Chesterton, fond of paradoxes, said that the more we make a word mean the less it means. Perhaps the greatest victim of such overuse in our modern culture is the word *love*. When we say that we love people and pizza, that we love God and golf, we dilute the meaning of the word love.

That word *love* is used frequently in Scripture, but with a clear and specific meaning. In Scripture love is not about *feeling* good. Love is about **doing** good. In fact, the Bible *commands* us to love. Modern society may have difficulty with a commandment to love. Many see love and law as mutually exclusive. But not Jesus. In the gospels Christ commanded love three times:

- 1) "A new commandment I give: Love one another, as I have loved you."
- 2) "Love your enemy," which is probably his most challenging command.
- 3) "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments." This double commandment to love God and our neighbor in today's gospel is founded on the Torah, the law of the Old Testament.

The selection of Christ for the greatest commandment among the many in the Torah was not surprising. He picked the odds-on favorite, the *Shema*, which is still the morning prayer of devout Jews: "Hear O Israel, The Lord our God is Lord alone. Therefore, love the Lord with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength."

The originality of Christ's answer, his unique insight, was his choice of a second commandment *and* its essential connection to the first. "The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself." The first and the greatest commandment, love of God, does not stand alone. It is connected essentially to love of neighbor.

The most significant verse in this gospel passage may well be, "The second is like it." Although the second choice of Christ, "Love your neighbor as yourself," was also from the Torah, the bond between the two commandments was not yet evident. That bond is *the* new insight of Christianity. Love of God and love of neighbor are inseparable, two parts of one law. Love of God must express itself in love of neighbor, and in loving our neighbor we express our love of God.

St. John stated this boldly when he wrote, "If anyone says, 'I love God,' but hates his neighbor, he is a liar. One who does not love the neighbor he has seen, cannot love the God he has not seen."

Services for Our Lady Help of Christians, Antonino, will be held Sunday, November 2nd at 12:00 noon.

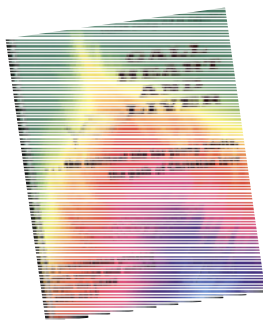
