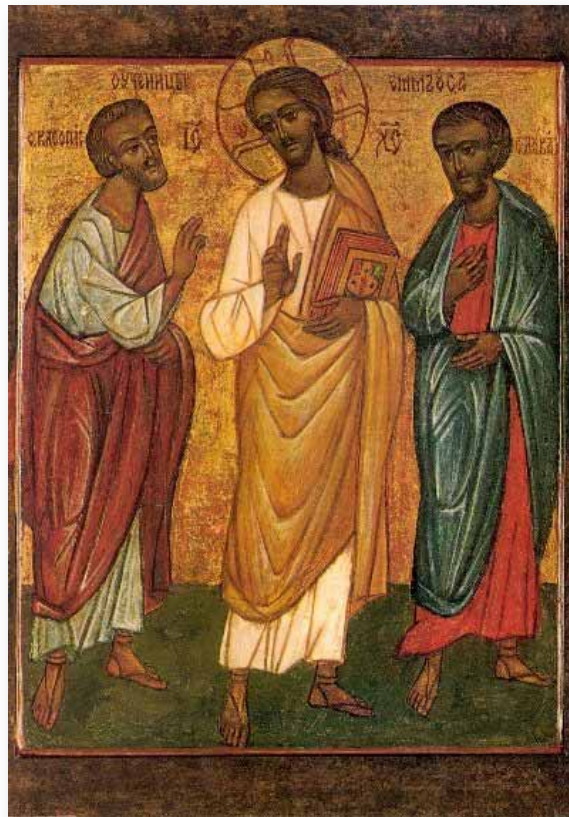

This coming Friday, April 24, is the feast day of the patron Saint of our Parish, St. Fidelis of Sigmaringen, O.F.M. Cap. (1577 - 1622). St. Fidelis was a Capuchin friar known for his fearless preaching of the Catholic faith in a time of much theological confusion known as the Counter-Reformation. He was murdered by his theological opponents in Switzerland in 1622 and was canonized in 1746.

St. Fidelis was born in 1577 at Sigmaringen in southern Germany to John and Genevieve Roy. He was baptized Mark but later took the name Fidelis when he entered the Capuchin Order. He was an exceptional student who received doctorates in both civil law and Canon Law. As a lawyer he was recognized as one who constantly upheld the causes of the poor and the oppressed. Nicknamed "the poor man's lawyer," Fidelis grew dissatisfied with the corruption and injustice he saw among his colleagues. He left his law career to become a priest, joining his brother George as a member of the Capuchin Order.

As a follower of Saint Francis, Fidelis continued his devotion to the weak and needy. During a severe epidemic in a city where he was guardian of a friary, Fidelis personally cared for many of the sick to the point of endangering his own health. But it was his tireless preaching with legal precision that gained attention.

He was appointed head of a group of Capuchins sent to preach the Catholic faith in an area of Switzerland where religion had unfortunately become entangled with politics. In advocating the Catholic faith he was accused of opposing the peasants' national aspirations for independence from Austria. While he was preaching at Seewis, a gun was fired at him, but he escaped unharmed. Many advised Fidelis to leave, but he declined, saying his life was in God's hands. On the road back, he was set upon by a group of armed men and was killed. The details of his death in the painting above the main altar of our church are more symbolic than historic. The Congregation for the Propagation of the Faith has recognized St. Fidelis as its first martyr.

The message of the life of all saints must be translated from the age in which they lived into our own age. The specific methods of St. Fidelis in presenting the Catholic faith to those resisting the faith may not be effective in our age. But his commitment to the Catholic faith is a message for our times. St. Fidelis used his training and talent as a lawyer to further the faith of the church in the service of the gospel.

We all have talents and training that we should apply not only to our daily secular pursuits but to the challenge of living our faith, not only for our own personal destiny, but as a light for others. St Fidelis' name itself is a message in our time. He was faithful, even to the point of death. St. Fidelis exemplifies an adage of the early Church, "the blood of the martyrs is the seed of the faith."



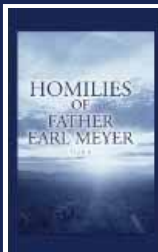

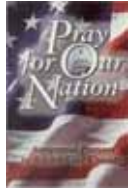
