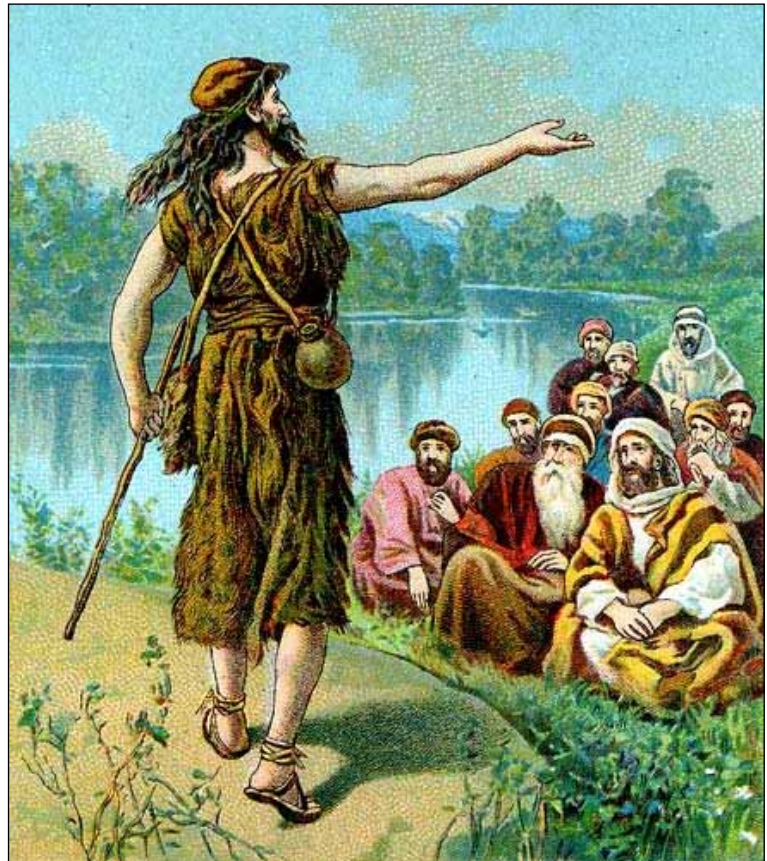

It Isn't Funny

I don't like getting pushed around for being a Jew, and I don't think Christians like getting pushed around for being Christians. I think people who believe in God are sick and tired of getting pushed around, period. I have no idea where the concept came from that America is an explicitly atheist country. I can't find it in the Constitution and I don't like it being shoved down my throat. Freedom is becoming a one way street.

Or maybe I can put it another way: where did the idea come from that we should worship celebrities and we aren't allowed to worship God as we understand Him? I guess that's a sign that I'm getting old. But there are a lot of us who are wondering where these celebrities came from and where the America we knew went to.

Recent tragic events of terrorist's attack and school shootings have everyone asking why. I think it started when Madeleine Murray O'Hare complained she didn't want prayer in our schools, and we said okay. Then someone said you better not read the Bible in school. The Bible says thou shalt not kill; thou shalt not steal, and love your neighbor as yourself. And we said okay.

Then Dr. Benjamin Spock said we shouldn't spank our children when they misbehave because their personalities would be warped and we might damage their self-esteem. We said an expert should know what he's talking about. And we said okay.

Now we're asking ourselves why our children have no conscience, why they don't know right from wrong, and why it doesn't bother them to kill strangers, their classmates, and themselves. And that's not okay.

Maybe if we think about it long and hard enough we will come to this simple conclusion: *we reap what we sow*. Funny how casually people trash God and then wonder why the world is going to hell. Funny how we believe what the newspapers say, but question what the Bible says. Funny how you can send "jokes" through e-mail and they spread like wildfire, but when you start sending messages regarding the Lord, people think twice about sharing. Funny how lewd, crude, vulgar and obscene articles pass freely through cyberspace, but public discussion of God is suppressed in the school, in the media, and in workplace.

Funny how TV commentators can say, "Happy Holidays," but embarrassed Christians can't say, "Merry Christmas." Funny how the president at the white house can call it a holiday tree, but pupils in school can't say Christmas tree. Funny how atheists can celebrate the winter solstice, but believers can't celebrate their wonderful Savior.

Funny how we can be more worried about what other people think of us than what God thinks of us. Maybe it isn't funny.

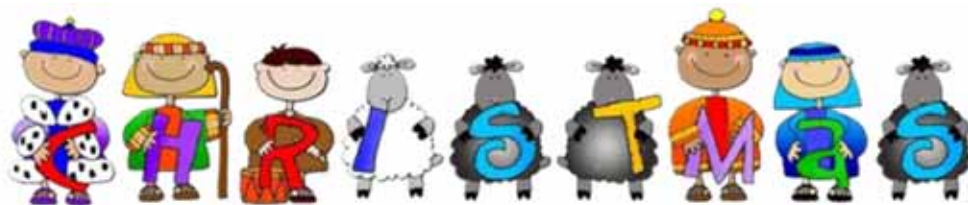

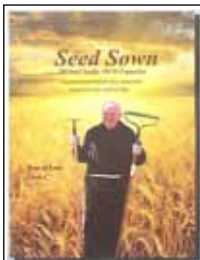
