Some Greeks who had come to worship at the Passover Feast came to Philip...and asked him,

“Sir, we would like to see Jesus.”

(from the Holy Gospel according to John 12:20-33)



"We would like to see Jesus," was the request in today's gospel of some Greeks who had approached the apostle Phillip. One can only wonder about their motivation. Did they hope to see a miracle worker, or a profound philosopher, or was it just idle curiosity? Regardless of motive, Jesus remains the most sought after person in all of history.

Faithful Christians also have that same desire, "We would like to see Jesus." Yet too often we miss him when we look for God only in the miraculous and the sensational or chase after visions and apparitions. We often search for him in vain in the sensational or superstitious when he is already in our midst.

Too often we cannot see the obvious. We have all searched in vain for an object which was right before us in plain view. Some things become such a familiar part of our landscape that we fail to notice them, paradoxically, because they are always there. We can also miss the divine presence because it is such a familiar part of ordinary life. God comes to us daily in our family and friends, our work and our leisure, our joy and our sorrow.

At times we fail to see the obvious because we do not want to see it. Selective blindness. In a like manner we do not see Jesus who is in our midst when we do not want to see Him. The Jesus we meet in Lent, for example, is often a Jesus we do not want to see. This is the Jesus who speaks to us about sin and salvation, repentance and reform, and in today's gospel, suffering and death. Yet these are some of the important ways that we meet the Lord as we live out the paschal mystery of the death and resurrection of Christ in our own life. "Unless the grain of wheat falls to the earth and dies it remains just a grain of wheat. But if it dies, it produces much fruit."

As the ancient Greeks, we modern Christians would like to see Jesus. But often we miss him, paradoxically, because He is always here, a part of our everyday life which we overlook because of familiarity. Or we miss him because we look for him in the wrong place, in the sensational and spectacular rather than in the routine and regular. Or we miss him because we do not want to see him when his presence challenges us to a better life or a deeper faith.

A faithful Christian can see Jesus in the ordinary people and familiar events of daily life: in the average child, the anxious spouse, the annoying beggar, the glowing sunset, the gathering storm, the blessing of health, the burden of sickness. If we sincerely would like to see Jesus, we need but look carefully into the stream of our daily life and we will realize that he is already with us.

. . . . and mirth

INTRODUCING THE INDIAN MISSIONARY SOCIETY

INDIAN MISSION SOCIETY

Welcome !

Our purpose is to develop our own priests with the background to reach out to the majority Hindu population, as well as to Buddhists, Muslims and other groups in India.

To do this, the Indian Missionary Society trains priests in its Seminary in Varnasi. We are sent forth to bring the message of Jesus to our neighbors. We build parishes, develop new schools and, by social outreach, develop local self-help by crisis intervention and community organizations.

To meet our needs, 15 priests serve in six U.S. dioceses throughout the Mid-South.

IMS FORMATION

In the Pre-Novitiate Program, students have intensive language studies (Hindi & English) and cultural integration through instrumental and vocal Indian music, yoga, and meditation. Through village visits, work with youth, and literacy programs, etc. they gain exposure to social realities. College, biblical & religious formation builds understanding of the IMS way of life. The Novitiate is a year of intensive discipline and IMS spiritual formation. Philosophical studies begin as the priestly students profess themselves to temporary membership and join 3 years of study at the College of Philosophy, Christmager. Theological studies test their personal integrity and maturity to finish fully equipped to join the IMS community and to serve the needy and oppressed. At the close of four years of formation, they will be ordained into the Priesthood.



Help & Educate Children

The Development Association for Research and Empowerment works for the rescue and rehabilitation of children trying to find food and shelter from trains and railway stations.

For 25 years, Fr. Abhi, IMS, has provided support for women, children and the disabled. He founded the Jan Vikas Samiti, the social welfare society of Varanasi Province of IMS. He has served as Provincial Superior of IMS, and regional coordinator for the Lilitane Foundation, a Holland foundation working with disabled children in 70 countries.

While traveling by train, he found children ages 3 to 17 trying to find food and shelter in stations across India, 300 in Varanasi alone. They come from nearby slums and villages to support themselves and their families. To provide a quality of life to at least some of them as well as to address some of their problems, Fr. Abhi has registered a trust with “DARE” in active collaboration with Sister Manju, SRA and a team in Varanasi.

THE STORY OF BINDU



I was living with my young brothers and mother at the Varanasi railway station. My mother died at the station in 2011. When she became ill, she entrusted me to the care of DARE knowing I would be in difficulty and that they could provide a better opportunity for me. I am studying in grade five at St. Mary's School, a prestigious Catholic school in Varanasi City.

I go daily to school with other children and come back in the afternoon. I am loved by Sr. Manju and Fr. Abhi and I get all I need to study and grow. I am very happy to have this opportunity. If I were at the railway station, I would have faced many difficulties and problems and would not have gone to school or received this quality of life.

I earned high school marks in 2013-2014. In the DARE Center I get a chance to do my studies and to develop my talent. I am also learning about computers. I want to become a teacher and help children who have no opportunity to study.

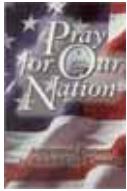
