**Blessed are the
 poor in spirit...**

**Rejoice and be glad,
 for your reward will be
 great in heaven.**

(from the Holy Gospel according to Mark 5:1-12a)



The gospel formula for holiness on this Feast of All Saints is the Eight Beatitudes. Our many great saints offer heroic examples of each of the Beatitudes.

“Blessed are the poor in spirit.” St. Louis of France, St. Elizabeth of Hungary – a king and a queen who cared for the poor.

“Blessed are they who mourn.” The sorrowful Mother inspired Michelangelo’s pieta.

“Blessed are the meek.” St. Theresa, the Little Flower, saint of the little way.

“Blessed are those who hunger for righteousness.” St. Ignatius of Loyola, founder of the Jesuits; St. Thomas Moore, patron saint of lawyers.

“Blessed are the merciful.” St. Lucy and St. Paul Miki who forgave their executioners.

“Blessed are the clean of heart.” St. Agnes, St. Aloysius, St. Maria Goretti, all young Christians who died rather than compromise their virtue.

“Blessed are the peace makers.” St Francis of Assisi, God’s messenger of peace.

“Blessed are those who are persecuted.” St. Stephen the proto-martyr, St. Lawrence, the deacon who was fried on a grill, St. Joan of Arc.

Such examples of Christian virtues are plentiful among the great saints. But that is only a small part of the message of today’s feast. Today is about All Saints, the big and the small, the known and the unknown, the past, the present, and the future.

Too often, we think of saints as people totally unlike ourselves. Perhaps some of the more famous Saints justify such thinking. But it is encouraging to know that most of the canonized saints led lives similar to our own. Most saints were not bishops or missionaries or cloistered nuns.

St. Isadore, for example, was a farmer, St. Conrad was a doorman, St. John Labare was a homeless vagrant, St. Zita was a cook, St. Peter Frassati was a soccer star, St. Piere Toussaint was a barber, St. Lucy was a domestic maid, St. Ignatius was a soldier, St. Bonaventure was a teacher, St. Albert was a scientist, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was a teacher, a nurse, a convert, a mother.

Countless other Christians have been heroic in ordinary daily life. Perhaps some touched your life: a gentle grandmother, a kindly neighbor, a devoted teacher, a pious nun. They lived the beatitudes for the glory of God, but also as good example to others.

St. Francis of Assisi is often quoted as having said that “Saints were just sinners who kept on trying.” Hang in there!
