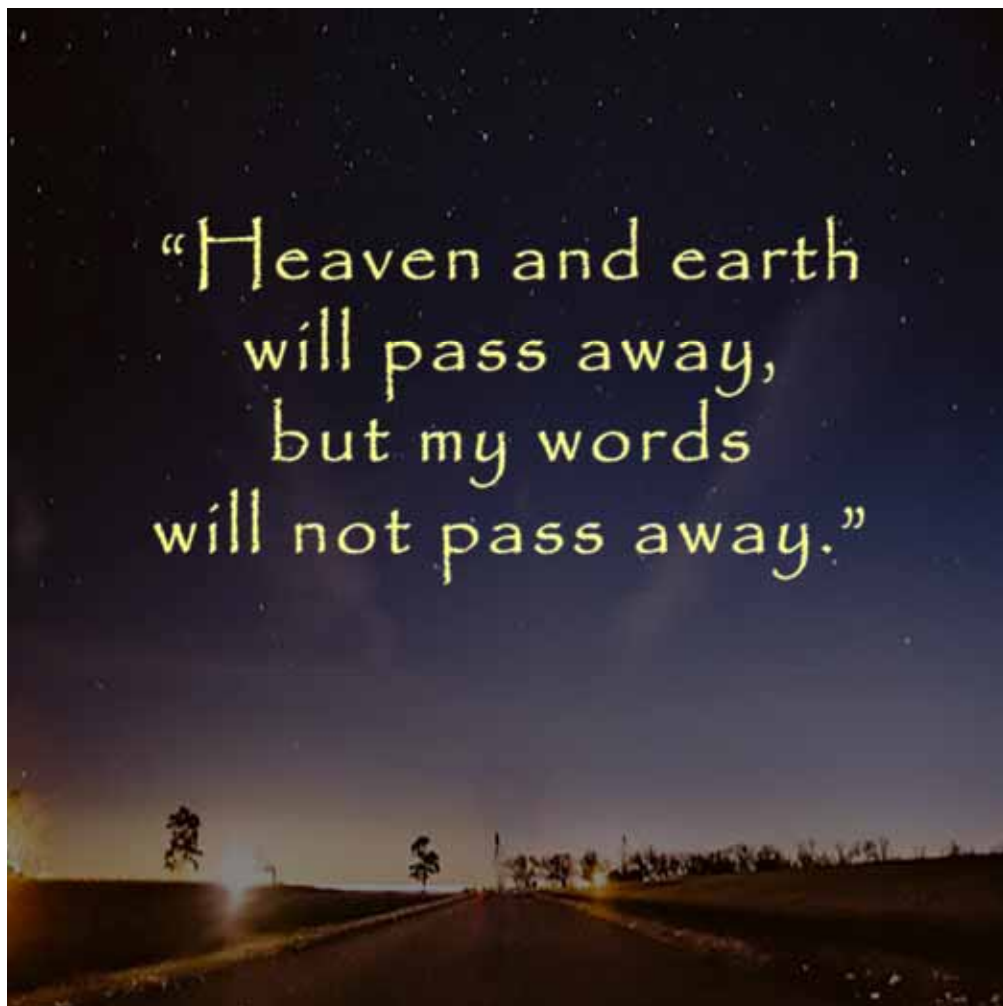

(from the Holy Gospel according to Mark 13:24-32)



You probably missed it, but the world was supposed to end on September 15, 2015. A few devout Christians, and even a few scientists, thought that the enormous solar flares calculated to erupt this past September would destroy life on our planet. Didn't happen. And that wasn't the only fatal disaster predicted for this past year. There were also to be cataclysmic earthquakes in Nepal, Behar, and Vijayawada, the rumblings of Mount Vesuvius and Mount Saint Helen, as well as the inversion of the earth's magnetic field. They didn't happen.

Yes, our world will end, and very likely by a physical cause such as those listed above. Today's gospel tells us as much. But it also concludes, "But of that day or hour, no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son but only the Father."

We are approaching the end of this liturgical year (B) and will begin a new liturgical year (C) on the first Sunday of Advent. At the end of each liturgical year we read from that year's gospel a mini-apocalypse, a short passage describing the end of time with dramatic images. These passages are not scientific treatises but allegories of the struggle between good and evil to assure us that in God's providence goodness will prevail.

Pausing to reflect on the end of the world is not a useless exercise in gloom. Scientists do it all the time, especially astronomers. It helps them to understand the processes of the universe and how we can best live with nature in the present moment. Most probably none of us will witness the end of the world, nor perish in its destruction. But the fact that there will be an end should affect the way we live now.

Such scientific research puts our earthly life in perspective. Today's gospel puts our spiritual life in perspective. Scripture frequently reminds us of the Second Coming of Christ. Christ will come again, and we should live so as to greet Him when he comes.

This Second Coming of Christ is preceded by his many other comings into our lives. Today's gospel prompts us to reflect also on the many endings in our personal world, special moments that redirect us on our pilgrim way: the death of a parent, the loss of a child, a serious illness, weddings, graduations. Such times are special moments of grace, moments to pause and consider where we are going, what our goals are, and how to live our faith.

The Second Vatican Council said of the end of the world: "We do not know the time of the end of the earth and of humanity. Nor do we know how all things will be transformed. The shape of this world, now deformed by sin, will pass away. And God is preparing a new dwelling where justice will abide. Meanwhile during the time that is left, we are to nurture human dignity, freedom, peace and all that is good in this life, for we will find them again, but free of stain, and transfigured." (LG 24)

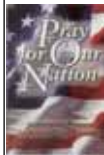

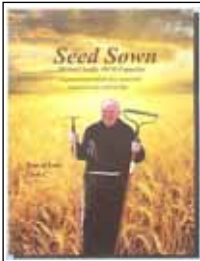
