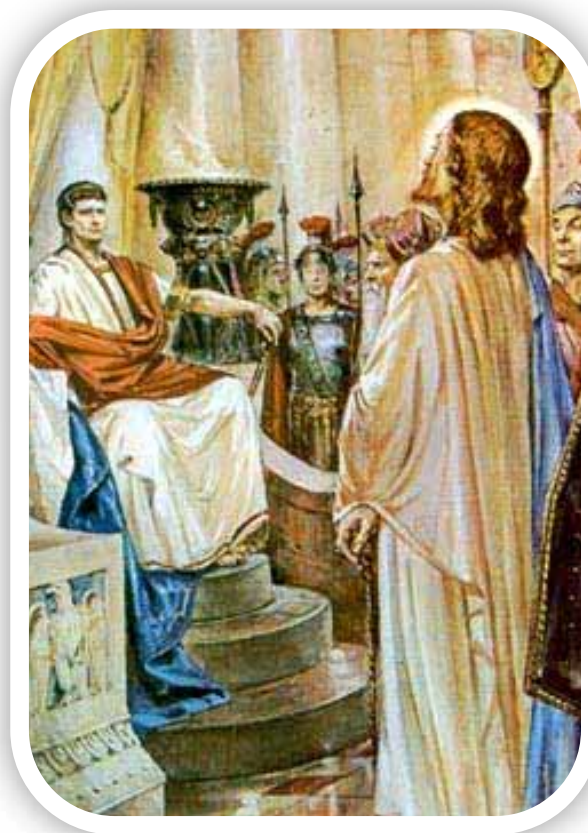

Today the church celebrates the *Solemnity of our Lord Jesus Christ the King*, more commonly known as the *Feast of Christ the King*. This feast was established in 1925 by Pope Pius XI as a response to the secularism that was on the rise in Europe which tried to undermine the significance of Christianity, questioning not only the teachings of Christ but even his historical existence.

In the aftermath of World War I, the rise of totalitarian regimes in Europe often attempted to assert authority over the Church. These belligerent dictatorships challenged both religious authority and religious freedom. Pope Pius XI hoped that the celebration of the feast of Christ the King would remind not only the faithful but also despotic rulers that the Church has the right to freedom of religion and immunity from state control in living its faith.

Those oppressive regimes no longer exist, but the threat of secularism to undermine Christianity has taken a more subtle form in our age. Originally a message for a critical time in the history of Europe, today's feast has significance for all ages.

In his encyclical which instituted this feast, the stated intention of Pope Pius XI was that this celebration among Christians would remind nationalistic leaders that Christ occupies a significant and enduring place in history; that his Church has the right to live its faith free from control by the state; and that Christ reigns in the hearts and minds and wills of the faithful.

The concept of Christ as king is not to be misunderstood as rivaling the secular kings of history. Christ radically redefined and transformed the concept of kingship. When asked by Pilate if he were a king he responded, "My kingdom is not of this world." In contrast to the domination of secular rulers, Christ is a king of humble service, and he commanded his followers to be servants as well. The humble service of Christ the King was to the point of his redemptive passion and death.

Christ the King will come to judge the nations, but the justice and judgment of his teachings are balanced with radical love, mercy, peace, and forgiveness. When we celebrate Christ as King, we are not celebrating a domineering ruler, but one willing to serve and even die for his subjects, one whose power is that of service.

The Feast of Christ the King was established as an antidote to a secular way of life which ignores God in one's thinking and living and organizes one's life as if God did not exist. That temptation is present anew in our age. Today's feast is intended to proclaim boldly Christ's royalty over the minds and hearts of his followers, and properly understood, even nations.

The preface of today's Mass describes well the kingdom of Christ, "A kingdom of truth and life, a kingdom of holiness and grace, a kingdom of justice, love and peace." As we pray so often in the Lord's Prayer, "Thy kingdom come."
