Jesus said to them, “The cup that I drink, you will drink, and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right or at my left is not mine to give but is for those for whom it has been prepared.”

(from the Holy Gospel according to Mark 10:35-45)



In today's gospel Christ inverts our ordinary social understanding of greatness. "Whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the salve of all. The Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and give his life as a ransom for many."

The Apostles James and John, sons of Zebedee, wanted the seats of honor on the right and left of Christ in the kingdom of God. Christ replied that such a thirst for power and glory may be the way of the dominant social order, but it is not to be the way of his followers. Christians must see that the opportunity to do good for others is the real and only way to lasting virtue and eternal glory.

In this gospel passage, as in many other of his teachings, Christ has turned the world on its head and invited us to look at our society and especially our own life in a new manner. "He who humbles himself will be exalted." "The first shall be last, and the last shall be first." "Whoever wishes to save his life will lose it; but whoever loses his life for my sake will save it."

The ultimate and foundational paradox of Christianity is life through death, embodied in the death and resurrection of Christ, the Paschal Mystery. As an illustration of this inverted order, consider the following clever essay:

"Beauty is in the eye of the beholder."

Today was the worst day ever.
And don't try to convince me that
There is something good in every day
Because when you take a close look,
This world is a pretty evil place.
Even if
Some goodness does shine through once in a while
Satisfaction and happiness don't last.
And it's not true that
It's all in the mind and heart
Because true happiness can be obtained
Only if one's surroundings are good
It's not true that good exists
I'm sure you can agree that
The reality
Creates
My attitude
It's all beyond my control
And you'll never in a million years hear me say that
Today was a good day.

Now read it from bottom to top.

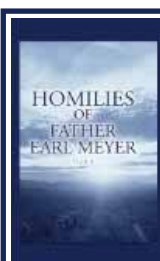

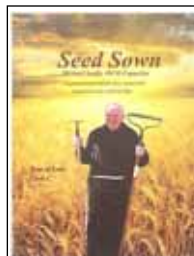

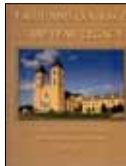
