. If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off. ... And if your eye causes you to sin, pluck it out.



In the musical "Fiddler on the Roof" Tevia observes that if everyone followed the Old Testament law of an eye for an eye the whole world would soon be blind. If Christians followed today's gospel literally and cut off every hand, foot, or eye that led to sin, the whole world might be crippled as well as blind.

Today's gospel might sound a bit gruesome, yet one cannot argue with the general principle. Surgeons use it all the time. Better to amputate a gangrenous limb than to infect the whole body fatally. For people of faith, it is a logical step to sacrifice a physical member to preserve spiritual life.

But a literalistic interpretation of this passage with an endorsement of mutilation for spiritual growth does not ring true with the compassionate teachings of Christ. Many wonder what this gospel really means when it says that a weak sinner should cut off a hand or a foot or tear out an eye to avoid damnation.

To understand the meaning of any difficult passage in Scripture, one must consider three criteria: the reaction of the original audience, its consistency with the rest of Scripture, and the understanding of the church through the centuries.

To understand today's gospel literally, as physical dismembering, would be contrary to all three of these. The audience of Christ did not react with horror; the gospels do not endorse mutilation; and the church has never understood this passage in a literal sense.

It was customary for ancient rabbis to use outlandish exaggerations which would be unforgettable, as "A camel through the eye of a needle." The lesson of this passage is not about surgery. It is about salvation. It is not about crippling, but about changing. The message is twofold: the soul is more important than the body and Christian conversion must be radical not superficial.

The gospel says it is better to enter the kingdom of God crippled, or maimed, or with one eye, than to be thrown into Gehenna. In contemporary terms one might say: Better a fair competitor who loses, than a winner who cheats. Better an honest hand which is empty, than a thief's hand that is full. Better a dim vision of beauty, than an eagle eye that is lecherous.

The message is that conversion must be complete. There are times when we need a total change in our life. A minor adjustment will not do. For example, if a chemical dependency is ruining your life, quit completely. Don't cut back on your drinking, quit drinking. If a relationship is a threat to your marriage, cut if off. No adjustment, no accommodations. Break it off. If you have anger in you heart, don't compromise with it. Don't feed it less. Starve it. Forgive.
