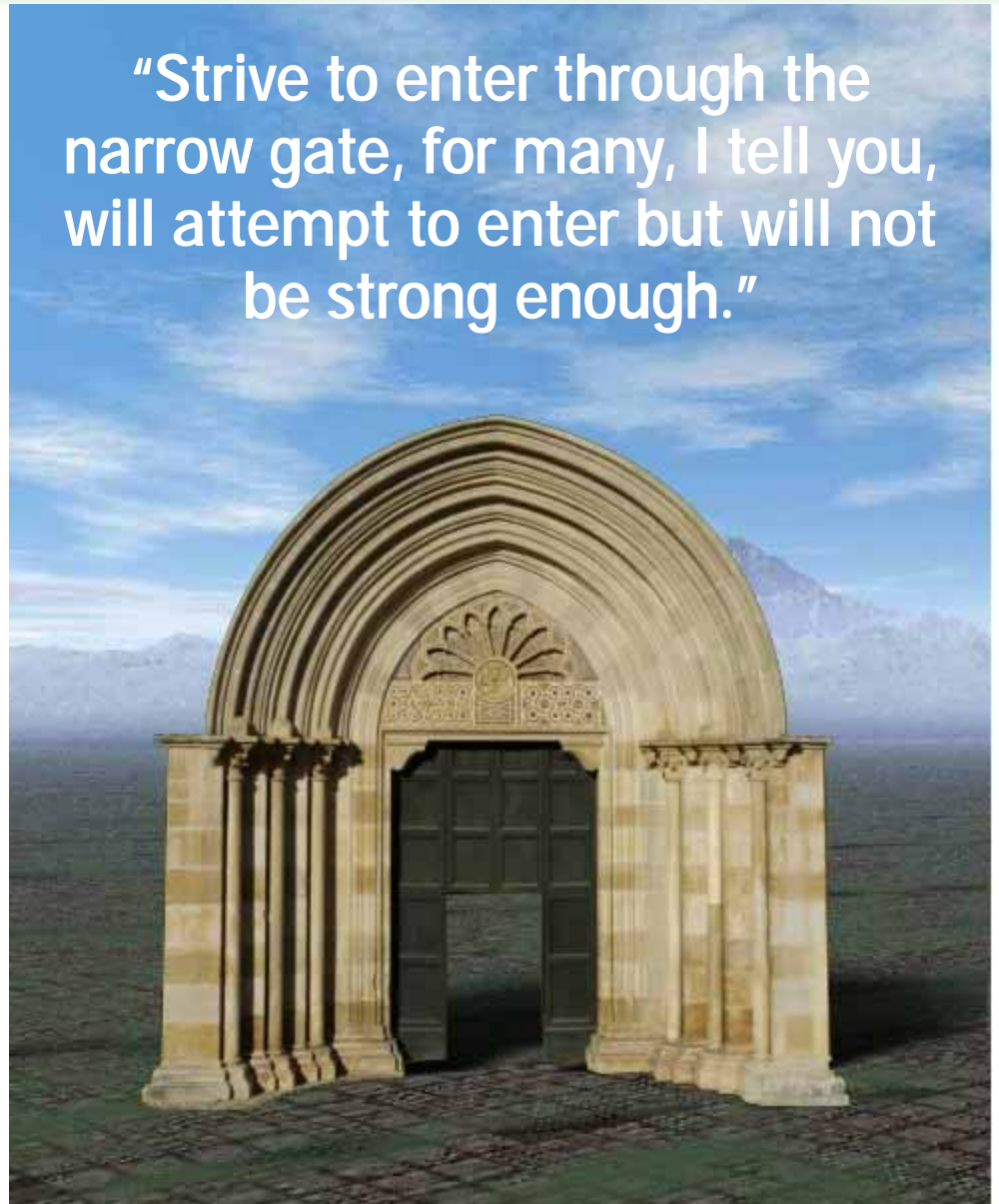

"Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough."



(from the Holy Gospel according to Luke 13:22-30)



Those bells not only call students back to class, they also announce a return to a more regular life for their parents and all of us. Evenings at the ballpark, vacation travel, and days at the lake are now memories and we must all return to a more routine daily life. We adults may not like it any more than the students, but we know that it is necessary and good for us. The *daily grind* works. It gets things done. It holds us to a timetable to complete the task at hand. If we do not set a schedule for ourselves our duties too easily go unmet.

The same is true in our spiritual life. We need a routine. We need to be faithful to our commitments. Today one often hears the opposite, that the life of the spirit is spontaneous and free from all schedules. A spiritual life free from all structure is not unlike the wish of a school boy for an endless summer – a flight of fancy from reality. Yet many moderns will insist, “I don’t need Sunday church. I don’t need daily prayers. My spiritual life is the spontaneous freedom of the spirit.”

It is true that openness to the promptings of the spirit is an essential element of the spiritual life and we must be willing to be moved by the spirit to new ways of thinking and acting. But the spiritual life rests on a foundation of basic values that must be nurtured by regular observance.

We need only look at the great spiritual leaders of the ages to realize the importance of faithful observance in religious practices. From the Tibetan Monks to the Trappist Monks, from Gandhi to the Dali Lama, from Mohammed to our Messiah — all were faithful to the religious practices of their community.

The gospel of Luke tells us that the parents of Jesus were devout observant Jews, who “according the Law of Moses, took the child up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord,” and “Each year his parents went to Jerusalem for the feast of Passover.” Christ and his disciples faithfully observed the Jewish feasts, such as the Passover, Pentecost, and the Feast of Tabernacles. The gospel of Luke (4:16) tells us that Jesus, “went to the synagogue on the Sabbath, *as was his custom.*”

It is true that an unbending fixation on routine can be a hindrance. But lack of routine is often more harmful. Christian virtues have been defined as “habits of the heart,” natural responses to the challenges of life as the result of daily practice. Take a lesson from any successful student: set a goal, develop a program, and keep a schedule.

Jean Millet’s famous painting, *The Angelus*, depicts a peasant couple pausing from their work in the field to pray as the angelus bell, which rings at fixed hours each day, peals from the church steeple in the distance. The daily prayer of the church, since the time of the early Christians, has been called the “Liturgy of the Hours,” reminding us by its very name that we are to be faithful to regular prayer.

School bells ring anew each fall to call students to new adventures in learning. Church bells ring each day to praise God, and to invite us to learn the will of God in our life by being true to the practice of our faith.

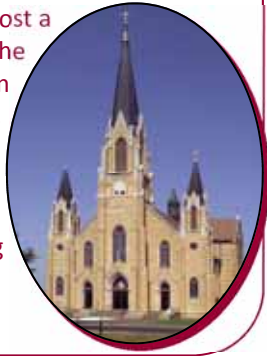
