Thursday, August 11, is the feast of St. Clare of Assisi, companion of Saint Francis of Assisi and the foundress of the Order of Saint Clare, known popularly as the Poor Clares. She was born in Assisi on July 16, 1194, and baptized Chiara Offreduccio, the eldest daughter in a wealthy noble family. At age 18 she heard St. Francis of Assisi preach a Lenten service in the local church of San Giorgio and asked him to help her live according to the Gospel. On Palm Sunday in 1212, Clare left her father's home quietly and went to the chapel of the Porziuncula to meet with Francis. While there, Clare's hair was cut off and she was given a plain robe and veil in exchange for her rich gown.

Clare then joined the convent of the Benedictine nuns of San Paulo near Assisi under the guidance of St. Francis. Her father sought her out, found her and tried to force her back into his home but she refused professing that she would no longer live a life of luxury but live as a poor follower of the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Clare's younger sister soon joined her at the Benedictine monastery, taking the name of Agnes. The two remained there until a convent was provided for them next to the church of San Damiano, which had been rebuilt by St. Francis and his early followers. Other women soon joined them and they became known as the "Poor Ladies of San Damiano." They lived a life of austerity, seclusion, manual labor, and prayer, according to a Rule which Francis gave them as the Second Franciscan Order. Initially the order was directed by St. Francis himself but in 1216 Clare became the abbess of San Damiano. After Clare's death, the order became known as the Order of Saint Clare.

St. Clare, as the feminine counterpart of St. Francis, is the embodiment of the reality that Christian spirituality is expressed differently but complimentarily by men and women and cannot be reduced to neuter format. Many of the great spiritual movements have rested on this duality: St. Benedict and St. Scholastica; St. John of the Cross and St. Theresa of Avila; Saint Augustine and Saint Monica.

A memorable historic event occurred in 1224 when an army of vagabond soldiers came to attack and pillage the city of Assisi. When the mob came to the church and convent at San Damiano, Clare went out to meet them with the Blessed Sacrament which she placed at the front wall where the army would have to see it. Then on her knees, she begged God to save the Sisters, "O Lord, save these Sisters whom I cannot now protect." In an unexplained sudden fright, the attackers panicked and fled without harming the sisters or doing further damage to the city of Assisi.

Clare died on August 11, 1253, at the age of 59, and two years later Pope Alexander IV canonized her as Saint Clare of Assisi. The Basilica of Saint Clare in Assisi was finished in 1260, and Clare's remains were transferred there and buried beneath the high altar. Some 600 years later, her remains were transferred once again to a newly constructed shrine in the crypt of the Basilica of Saint Clare where they remain today.

St. Clare was designated as the patron saint of television in 1958 by Pope Pius XII, because when she was ill and could not attend Mass she was reportedly able to see and hear it in her room. She is also the patroness of eye disease, goldsmiths, and laundry. Clare is often pictured carrying a monstrance to commemorate the time she warded off the soldiers at the gates of her convent with the Blessed Sacrament.

One final observation: in our Basilica of St. Fidelis, there are statues and stained glass windows of many great women Saints including St. Theresa of Lisieux, St. Ann, St. Theresa of Avila, St. Agnes, and St. Elizabeth, but there is no representation of Saint Clare of Assisi. An embarrassing omission by the Capuchin Franciscans!
