Amen, I say to you, among those born of women there has been none greater than John the Baptist; yet the least in the kingdom of Heaven is greater than



Monday, December 12, is the feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, patroness of the Americas. There are many approved apparitions of Mary, but Our Lady of Guadalupe is of special significance to the Americas, especially Central America.

The Catholic missionaries to Mexico in the sixteenth century had very little success. The ancient Aztec religion, which included human sacrifice, had a powerful hold on the people and their culture. Also, the native people were naturally suspicious of foreigners as representing outside oppression.

Then in 1531 the Virgin Mary appeared to Juan Diego, a simple Indian native, and within a few years six million native Mexicans were baptized as Christians. Mary told Juan Diego to ask the bishop to build a church on the site where she appeared. The Bishop asked for evidence. So Mary told Juan Diego to gather roses miraculously blooming on that hill in December and take them to the Bishop in his mantel. On that mantel in which he carried the roses Mary left an image of herself. The cloth of that mantel, a *tilma*, should have deteriorated in about twenty years but it shows no sign of decay 485 years later and its image still defies all scientific explanations of its origin. On that hill where Mary appeared is the present Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

That image of Mary on the peasant's tilma is that of the Brown Virgin (La Morenita), an indigenous mestiza, clothed with the sun and wearing the cinta, the band of pregnancy, standing on the moon, head bowed and hands folded in prayer, and born aloft by an angel of the Lord. This image is central to the native people's devotion to Mary and the Christian faith taking root in their land. She identified herself as "the ever-virgin Mary, Mother of the True God, the Creator of all things, Lord of heaven and the earth." Hispanics are uniquely devoted to Our Lady of Guadalupe for without her they would not have come to know her Son. The events at Guadalupe teach us that God uses Mary in a special way to lead people of every land to Jesus.

The late New Testament scholar, Raymond Brown, wrote: "In the Indian tradition, when Mary appeared in the ancient garb of the mother of the Indian gods, she promised love and compassion, defense and help, to all the inhabitants of that land. Ten years before, the whole Indian nation, their gods and their tradition had been destroyed. She heard their lamentations and their miseries, their pains and their sufferings. She proclaimed the Gospel of hope for the oppressed. In the Gospel, God's Son promises salvation for those who have nothing. That is exactly what happened in the case of Our Lady of Guadalupe. She gave the hope of the Gospel to a people whose devotion to her is an authentic expression of faith in Christ."

Mary appeared to Juan Diego not as the traditional European Madonna but as a beautiful Aztec princess speaking to him in his own native language. If we want to help others accept the gospel, we must appreciate the culture in which they live. Faith is lived and expressed through a specific culture. That is true not only of missionaries to foreign lands but also of Christians offering the witness of their faith today in our secular world.

The Virgin of Guadalupe belongs in our Advent preparations as we long for the coming of Christ to fill our spiritual poverty. Our Lady of Guadalupe proclaims, as did Mary in her *Magnificat*, the good news of salvation through Christ, the Son of God the Father who "scatters the proud, exalts the lowly, fills the hungry with good things and remembers his promises to Abraham and his children for ever."




