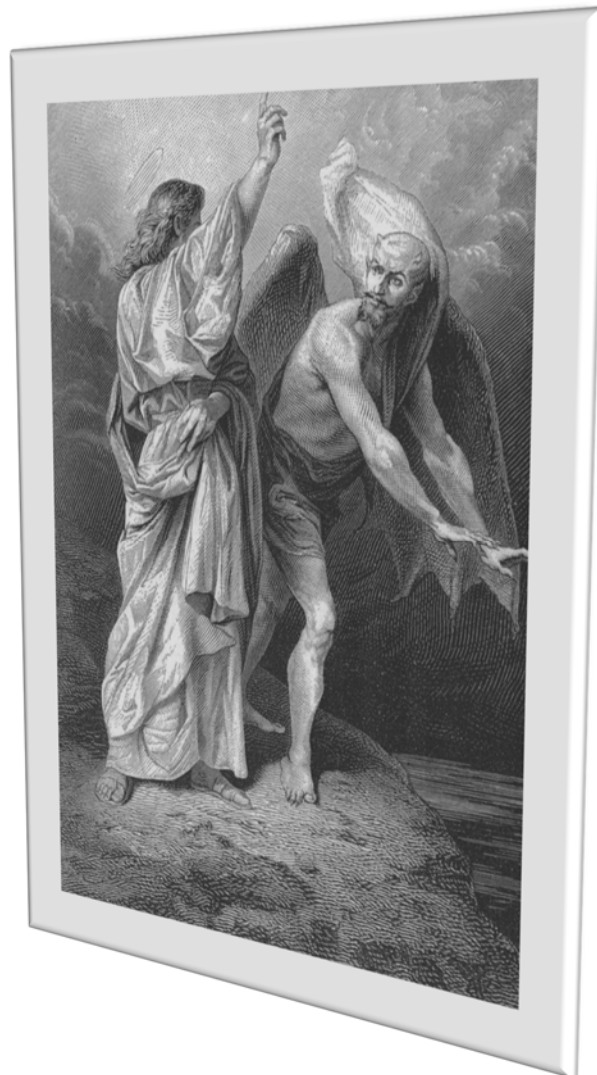

Valentine's Day

... Jesus returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the desert for forty days, to be tempted by the devil.



(from the Holy Gospel according to Luke 4:1-13)



The trademark symbol for this Valentine's Day is a heart. The simple lines which sketch the outline of a human heart are two arced lines which resemble mirrored question marks. Such question marks quite subtly convey the enigma of our hearts and the complex meaning that *heart* has in all world cultures.

Science teaches that the heart is a hollow muscular organ which pumps blood through the body. It is an essential organ, but no more vital than the lungs or the liver or the kidneys. Perhaps because people could hear and feel the heart's pulse inside their bodies, they assumed that this one muscle controlled our thoughts and moods and even our humanness. Through the ages philosophers have attributed to the heart such qualities as the intellect, courage, moral judgment, compassion and romantic love.

Our moral makeup and our virtues are also thought of as coming from the heart. The Bible says that when Pharaoh refused to let the Jews leave God hardened his heart. When we act with courage and resolve those qualities come from the heart. An athlete who doesn't give up plays with a lot of heart. To prove our steadfast resolve, we cross our hearts. During this Lenten season we are asked to change our hearts.

Compassion also is said to reside in the heart. People who are sensitive to the suffering of others are soft-hearted or tender-hearted. A "bleeding heart" sarcastically describes those inclined to be overly sympathetic, in contrast to those who believe that undisciplined sentiments can deter others from developing self-reliance. There is also the hard-hearted person who uses others for his or her own selfish advantage.

Throughout the ages, the heart has been mostly the repository of love. We swoon over a heartthrob and we woo a sweetheart. We pledge our hearts to our lovers. And when things go wrong we are broken hearted and we become downhearted.

In our Catholic tradition the heart of Jesus is the Sacred Heart and nothing is as pure as the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Scripture speaks of the enigmatic power of the heart many times, the word *heart* appearing more than one thousand times in the Bible:

"Keep your heart with all diligence; for out of it are the issues of life." ([Prov 4:23](#)) "O that there were such a heart in them, that they would fear me, and keep all my commandments always, that it might be well with them, and with their children for ever." ([Deut 5:29](#)) "I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you; I will remove from you your heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh." ([Ez 36:26](#)) "Out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaks." ([Matt 12:34](#)) "A good man out of the good treasure of the heart brings forth good things: and an evil man out of the evil treasure brings forth evil things." ([Matt 12:35](#)) "For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be." ([Mt 6:21](#))

These many aspects of the human heart—its anatomic design, our complex thoughts and feelings, and the wise counsel of Scripture—should cause us to marvel at the richness and depth of humanity's capacity for love, courage, will, passion and grief, and to appreciate the creative ways in words and symbols that convey those sentiments and emotions—and not only on Valentine's Day.

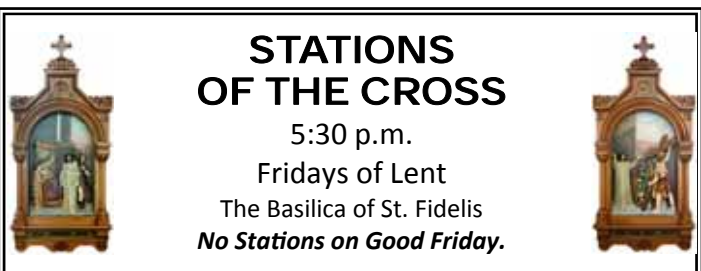

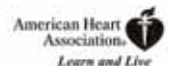

PLENARY INDULGENCE GIVEN WHEN VISITING A BASILICA

The faithful may obtain a plenary indulgence by visiting a minor basilica. An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment for a previously forgiven sin.
