ASH WEDNESDAY—FEBRUARY 10

Lent is a time of grace and renewal for the entire Church, especially for the catechumens and candidates preparing for initiation during the Easter Triduum. The three traditional ascetical practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are important pillars for a faithful experience of Lent. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting (for those 14 through 59) and abstinence (for those 14 and over). The Fridays of Lent remain days of abstinence.



MASSSES ON ASH WEDNESDAY:

6:45 A.M. AND 7:00 P.M. AT THE BASILICA OF ST. FIDELIS



This Wednesday every Catholic church in the world will be crowded. It is not a Holy Day of obligation, not a Feast Day, not a civil holiday. It is a work day in the middle of the week and people have busy schedules with little time for leisure. There is no social or parish or peer pressure to attend church on Ash Wednesday. Yet there are crowds, big crowds

The message in church on Ash Wednesday is not pleasant. You are not affirmed or thanked or assured that you are doing just fine as a good Christian. On the contrary, you are challenged. You are told that you need to pray, to fast, and to give alms. You are told that you are a sinner and that you need to change your life and repent, "Turn away from sin and be faithful to the gospel." You are reminded in blunt graphic terms of your mortality, "Remember that you are dust and to dust you will return." Yet on Ash Wednesday people flock to church and listen attentively to these unpleasant truths. There will be crowds, big crowds.

On Ash Wednesday you are reminded not only that you are a sinner but that you will die and that you will face God in judgment. No *alleluias* on Ash Wednesday. The readings from Scripture are not about love and joy, but about sin and death. Nothing nice or comforting is given out: no palms, no Easter water, not even a bulletin. No bake sales, no coffee klatch, no social gatherings to swell the crowd. Your appearance, which you carefully preened earlier in the day to enhance your beauty, is ruined with a smudge of ugly ashes. Yet there will be crowds, big crowds.

And Catholics will return to their workplace, to the market place, to their social circle with this Catholic stigma, a smudge of ashes on their forehead. A stigma respected, however grudgingly, by those of other faiths or no faith. A bold, proud stigma. It says in the power unique to symbols, "We mean business." Catholicism is a no-nonsense faith. We will not compromise our faith, nor the practice of our faith to accommodate popular culture. We are marked as different from others. There may be awkward questions from curious unbelievers. This is not the way to enhance your social status. Yet there will be crowds, big crowds.

On Ash Wednesday, Christians wrestle with the unpleasant truth that we are all sinners in need of repentance and forgiveness. We need redemption. And we admit that we cannot do it ourselves. We need God's grace. So we come to church for this ancient ceremony asking for a new grace to live a new life, a better Christian life.

Ash Wednesday is about a human truth, a spiritual truth, an eternal truth. It is about the frailty of our human nature, our inherent weakness, our propensity to sin. It is about our responsibility to live honorably before God and our neighbor. It is about the eternal consequences of our earthly life. These are the essential truths of life. That is why there will be crowds, big crowds.
