Our immigrant ancestors were welcomed by the Statue of Liberty to America, the land of freedom. With trust in divine providence they left many things behind. Their hope for the future had only one assurance: they would be free. On this Fourth of July weekend we rightly and proudly celebrate our freedom. We should also reflect on the responsibilities of that freedom.

Kansas editor, William Allen White wrote, "Liberty is the only thing you can't have unless you give it to others." George Bernard Shaw wrote, "Liberty means responsibility." Scriptures says, "Live as free people, yet do not use your freedom as a pretext for evil." (1Pt 2:16)

Freedom is something of a paradox. St. Peter and St. Paul boasted that they were slaves of Christ. (2Pt 1:1; Rom 1:10) Yet both tell us that they were free in the truth of Christ. (1Pt 2:16; Rom 8:21) Perhaps the most insightful thought of Scripture regarding freedom are the words of Christ to his disciples: "If you remain in my word, you will truly be my disciples, and you will know the truth, and *the truth will set you free.*" (Jn 8:32) Truth offers freedom, yet truth can be very demanding. Freedom can be paradoxical.

Pope John Paul II wrote, "The Ten Commandments are the Magna Carta of human freedom." The Magna Carta was the charter of political and civil liberties granted to all English citizens by King John in 1215. It is widely regarded as the basic document of democracy as well as the foundation for the Rule of Law. The Magna Carta speaks at one and the same time of freedom and law. Again that paradox.

The Ten Commandments are the Magna Carta of human freedom, yet they frequently admonish, "Thou Shalt Not." How does *Thou Shalt Not* make us free? Are Christians who live their baptismal promises free? Are those who wear wedding rings free? Are religious under vows free? What is the key to this paradox?

The perfection of freedom is to do the right thing, freely. Any pretense of freedom as unbridled license or absence of all restraint is a false freedom, a slavery in disguise. To choose to do the wrong thing is not the way of freedom but a slippery path to the slavery of evil. It is an invitation to addiction, which destroys liberty. Alcoholics and drug addicts know this paradox of freedom only too well. To a lesser degree, so do those hooked on caffeine, nicotine, and the cocoa bean. If "I have to have it," I am no longer free. Our freedom can be measured by the number of things we can walk away from.

We can be freed from slavery to our sinful weaknesses by cooperating with the grace of God. God's grace is offered freely, but the ball is our court since we must cooperate with God's grace to make it effective.

The salvation offered by Christ is essentially a spiritual freedom from sin and death. Such freedom is not only heavenly joy, but also earthly liberty. The truth of Christ sets us free by showing us the right use of freedom. The Saints were not only holy, they were also happy. And they were happy because they were truly free. The grace of Christ can free us from slavery to our weaknesses. We are truly free when we freely choose to do what is right. Such is the freedom of the children of God.



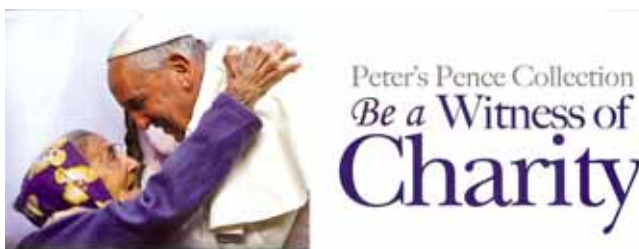


**Salina Diocese Men’s Conference**
