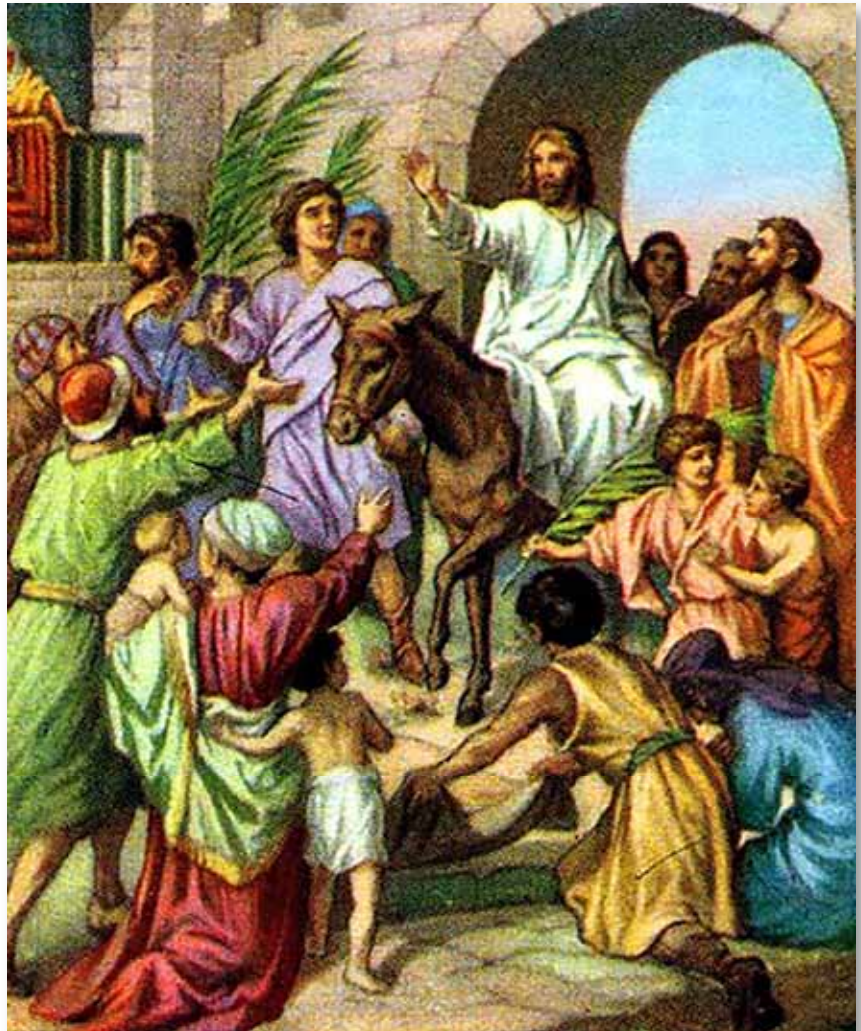

(from the Holy Gospel according to Luke 19:28-40)



Each year on Palm Sunday we read a gospel account of the Lord's Passion. We also read another gospel at the blessing of the palm. Due to time constraints that gospel is seldom explained, so . . .

The triumphal entry of Christ into Jerusalem to begin Holy Week is told in all four gospels. Today we read from the gospel of Luke. The coming of the Messiah as a triumphant king into his own city is enhanced with symbols: the donkey, the spreading of garments, the palm branches, and the cheering of the crowd. These symbols are taken from the Old Testament and would have been understood well by the early Christians.

The requisition of a means of transport, especially an animal on which no one had yet sat, was the right of a king. Jesus is making a royal claim but his manner suggests a kingdom of peace, not power. The disciples laying their garments on the donkey was a gesture of enthronement in the tradition of King David who embodied the promise of a Messiah. (2 Kings 9:13) The crowd endorses the enthronement by spreading their garments along the path of Christ.

While the other three gospels mention that the people cut branches from trees and spread them on the road, Luke makes no mention of the branches. He says only, "They spread their garments on the road." (Lk 19:36) Only John refers to the palms which have named this day, "They took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him." (Jn 12:13) Such branches and palm is an ancient gesture of welcome for a victorious king.

In Matthew, Mark, and John the people cry, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord." That is a verse from the Pilgrim Psalm (118:23) used as a cheer of thanksgiving and jubilation at the Feast of Tabernacles. Luke, addressing an audience of Greeks, does not use the Hebrew expression, "Hosanna" but says rather, "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord. Peace in heaven and glory in the highest." This echoes the announcement of the angels at the birth of Christ earlier in Luke's gospel. It is Luke's way of announcing the fulfillment of the promised Messiah and King.

Luke concludes this passage of the entry into Jerusalem with a verse not found in the other gospels. When the Pharisees complained about the people cheering they asked Christ to stop them. He replied, "I tell you, if they keep silent, the stones will cry out." (Lk 19:40) That is an Old Testament expression taken from the Book of Habakkuk, "The very stones will cry out from the wall and the beam will respond from the woodwork." (Hab 2:11) The stones recall also a Psalm verse used earlier in Luke, "The stone which the builder has rejected has become the cornerstone." (Ps 118:22, Lk 20:17) What the Pharisees have rejected has now become the glory of God's kingdom.

The pilgrims accompanying Jesus into Jerusalem voiced their joyful praise of God with the hope that their promised Messiah had arrived. That is our prayer this Palm Sunday. We come to church to praise God, hoping that our Messiah will come again and renew his kingdom in our hearts, our homes, and our world.

The faithful may obtain a plenary indulgence by visiting a minor basilica. An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment for a previously forgiven sin. To obtain a plenary indulgence during a pilgrimage to a basilica, one must participate in any sacred rite or recite the Lord's Prayer or the profession of faith while there, then go to Confession and Communion and pray for the intention of the pope. ~taken from *The Register*, the Salina Diocese newspaper
