

We continue with selected quotes from *Amoris Laetitia*, the recent letter on marriage and family from Pope Francis. We have previously offered some of his thoughts on the commitment of a Christian marriage and the relationships of parents and children. This week we have selections on the difficult topic of broken marriages and irregular unions.

Divorce and Multiple Marriages

Pope Francis wants the church, through dialogue and discernment, to help those in irregular marriages to understand "the divine activity of grace in their lives." By this he means a discernment of how God is acting in the difficult and unusual circumstances of their life. He notes that the situations of couples can be very different and should not be pigeonholed in predetermined classifications. "One thing of special consideration is a second union consolidated over time, with new children, proven fidelity, generous self giving, Christian commitment, a consciousness of its irregularity and of the great difficulty of going back without feeling in conscience that one would fall into new sins. The Church acknowledges situations where, for serious reasons, such as the children's upbringing, a man and woman cannot satisfy the obligation to separate."

"There are also the cases of those who made every effort to save their first marriage and were unjustly abandoned, or of those who have entered into a second union for the sake of the children's upbringing, and are sometimes subjectively certain in conscience that their previous and irreparably broken marriage had never been valid."

Separation and Moral Obligations

"The divorced and remarried should ask themselves: how did they act towards their children when the martial union entered into crisis; whether or not they made attempts at reconciliation; what has become of the abandoned party; what consequences the new relationship has on the rest of the family and the community of the faithful; and what example is being set for young people who are preparing for marriage."

Counseling the Separated and Divorced

Pope Francis sets this topic in a positive framework: "Divorced and remarried couples should always be made to feel part of the church. They are not excommunicated and should not be treated as such, since they remain part of the church."

He then speaks of a process of accompaniment and discernment which "guides the faithful to an awareness of their situation before God. Conversation with a priest in the internal forum contributes to the formation of a correct judgment on what hinders the possibility of a fuller participation in the life of the Church. It can also clarify what steps can be taken to foster it and make it grow. Given that *gradualness* is not in the law itself, this discernment can never ignore the Gospel demands of truth and charity, as proposed by the Church. For this discernment to happen, some conditions are necessary: humility, discretion and love for the Church and her teaching, in a sincere search for God's will and a desire to make a more perfect response to it."

"These attitudes are essential for avoiding misunderstandings, such as any priest can quickly grant 'exceptions', or that some people can obtain sacramental privileges in exchange for favors. When a responsible person, who does not presume to put his or her own desires ahead of the common good of the Church, meets with a pastor understanding the seriousness of the matter before him, they must avoid the risk that a specific discernment may lead people to think that the Church maintains a double standard."
