“Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be powerful earthquakes, famines, and plagues from place to place; and awesome sights and mighty signs will come from the sky.”

(from the Holy Gospel according to Luke 21:5-19)



In the old westerns the good guys in white hats always out-gunned the bad guys in black hats. Star Wars, Harry Potter, and the Lion King are modern versions of that same struggle between good and evil. These are modern secular forms of the apocalyptic literature of Scripture. The most notably apocalyptic scripture is in the Book of Revelation and the Book of Daniel. Many people find these books difficult to read, and it usually takes a trained scripture scholar to lead you through them. The basic message of these and all apocalyptic scripture, told in symbolic and allegorical language, is the simple truth that good will ultimately triumph over evil.

Besides the two great books of apocalyptic literature, the Book of Revelation and the Book of Daniel, each of the gospels has a mini-apocalypse with dramatic images portraying the struggle of good and evil at the end of time. These passages are not scientific treatises but allegories in figurative language of the struggle between good and evil to assure us that in God's providence goodness will prevail. We read those passages at the end of each liturgical year to reflect on the end of time before we begin Advent. Advent will then begin by reflecting on the end of time with the hope of salvation promised in the coming Messiah.

Today's reading, the mini-apocalypse of the gospel of Luke, emphasizes that the end of time is not a threat but a fulfillment of a promise. The grace of God will sustain his people through all their trials: their daily trials, their personal losses, their final test, and ultimately, the faithful will see the glory of the Lord.

Pausing to reflect on the end of the world is not a useless exercise in gloom. Scientists, especially astronomers, do it to understand the workings of the universe to live more effectively in the present world. The fact that there will be an end should affect the way we live now. Such scientific research puts our earthly life in perspective. Today's gospel puts our spiritual life in perspective. Christ will come again, and we should live so as to greet Him when he comes.

This Second Coming of Christ is preceded by his many other comings into our lives. Today's gospel prompts us to reflect also on the many endings in our personal world, special moments that redirect us on our pilgrim way: the death of a parent, the loss of a child, a serious illness, weddings, graduations. Such times are special moments of grace, moments to pause and consider where we are going, what our goals are, and how to live our faith. Ultimately these are not causes of despair but graces of hope.

While many fundamentalists have interpreted the apocalyptic scriptures with a sense of alarm and dread and even fear, that has never been the Catholic perspective.

The Second Vatican Council said of the end of the world: "We do not know the time of the end of the earth and of humanity. Nor do we know how all things will be transformed. The shape of this world, now deformed by sin, will pass away. And God is preparing a new dwelling where justice will abide. Meanwhile during the time that is left, we are to nurture human dignity, freedom, peace, and all that is good in this life, for we will find them again, but free of stain, and transfigured." (LG 24)
