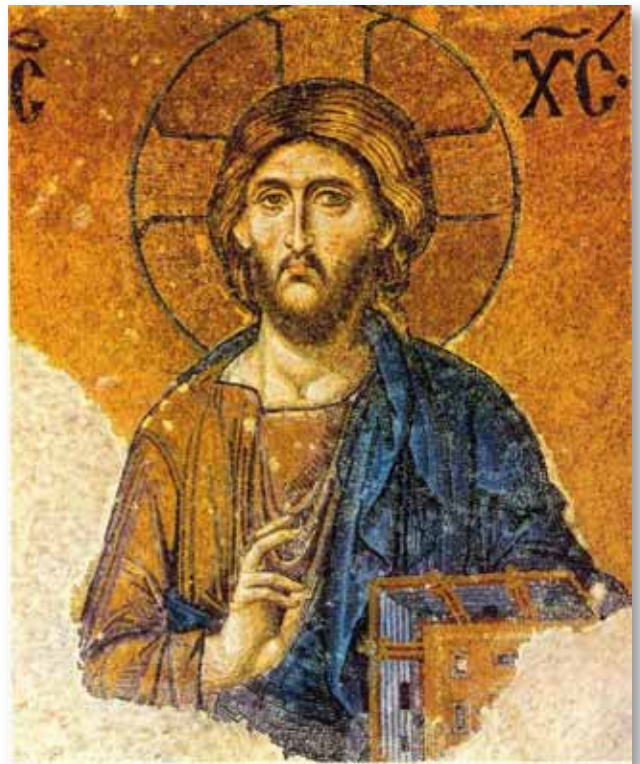

No Eucharistic Adoration

The Parish Office will close at noon on Wednesday, November 23, and all day Thursday & Friday, November 24-25.



General George Patton, after his heroic command of the allied forces in the Northern African Campaign was confident that he would be given the command for the invasion of Italy. But that command was given to Britain's Bernard Montgomery and Patton was assigned to a phantom force in France to divert the German attention from Normandy Beach. A deeply disappointed Patton wrote in his diary: *"Thanksgiving Day, 1942. I have nothing to be thankful for. So I did not give thanks today."* Just a few weeks later, on January 10, 1943, General Patton was appointed commander of the third army for Operation Overlord, the invasion of Europe, where he swept through Europe, endured the Battle of the Bulge, and led his victorious army into Germany.

Such twists of fate in our lives are often referred to as "blessings in disguise." We have all had disappointments, setbacks, and failures that hurt us deeply at the time. But so often the fortunes of life change in such away that these disappointments of the moment are later seen in the larger design of providence as blessings.

The West Side Baptist Church in Beatrice, Nebraska, had a faithful choir of fifteen that practiced every Wednesday at 7:00 p.m. On Wednesday March, 1, 1950, not a single member showed up for practice, all having sudden personal or family emergencies. The disappointed choir director left at 7:20 p.m. At 7:27 p.m. the building exploded. It is often referred to as the miracle of Beatrice, Nebraska. Many of us have had similar, if much less dramatic, events in our lives. Yes, some might be just an odd coincidence. But in the larger picture of our life it is difficult to deny the providence of God.

It is easy, only natural, to be grateful for the abundant blessings which enrich our lives. How could one not appreciate good health, good friends, and good fortune? But to be thankful for the hidden blessings of life challenges even devout Christians. One such blessing of aging, for example, is a perspective on our life which can see that some disappointments in the past were actually "blessings in disguise."

This might be especially true of the hidden blessings of faith. Perhaps you were upset by unanswered prayers, moral teachings of the church, changes in the liturgy, even the odd personality of a priest. Yet with the advantage of hindsight, you came to see that many of these were occasions for you to grow in your faith. A secure faith is a great blessing. But challenges to our faith are opportunities to develop a yet deeper faith.

So if you are struggling this Thanksgiving with difficulties of faith, weary of an illness, troubled with uncertain finances, or challenged by a difficult relationship, know that gratitude in abundance is a "cheap" virtue. But thanksgiving in trials, rooted in hope with trust in the providence of God, is the sterling virtue of faithful Christians. The Crucifixion is the ultimate "blessing in disguise." The Paschal Mystery, the mystery of the death and the resurrection of Christ, the central belief of our faith, is celebrated in each Eucharist, and the word *Eucharist* means *Thanksgiving*.

A disappointed Patton wrote in his diary: *"Thanksgiving Day, 1942. I have nothing to be thankful for. So I did not give thanks today."* May God grant each of us the grace to see beyond our daily trials to the greater pattern of his providence so that on Thanksgiving Day 2016 we can write in the diary of our hearts, *"Today I gave thanks."*

Why do we celebrate Christmas on December 25? How did Saint Nicholas become Santa Claus? Why do we have Christmas trees? **Charting Christmas** provides answers to these questions and many more as it explores the history of Christmas.



Filmed on location in the Holy Land and the United Kingdom, this documentary traces the origins of Christmas traditions beginning with the biblical prophecies concerning the Messiah and the New Testament accounts of His birth.
