**THE PARISH OFFICE WILL BE CLOSED FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 11,
 IN OBSERVANCE OF VETERANS DAY**



On Tuesday most Americans will be relieved. Perhaps frustrated and disappointed, they will nevertheless be glad that this uncivil presidential campaign is finally over.

Now a great dilemma hangs over us: how to vote. No one has the right to coerce your vote. Your vote is the right and the duty of your informed conscience. As Pope Francis said, "The church has been called to form consciences, not to replace them." To that end the Catholic Bishops have issued a document, "Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship." Here are a few pertinent quotes from that document.

"We bishops do not intend to tell Catholics for whom or against whom to vote. Our purpose is to help Catholics form their consciences in accordance with God's truth. The Church's obligation to participate in shaping the moral character of society is a requirement of our faith. It is a basic part of the mission we have received from Jesus Christ, who offers a vision of life revealed to us in Sacred Scripture and Tradition. At the center of these truths is respect for the dignity of every person. This is the core of Catholic moral and social teaching."

"Catholics often face difficult choices about how to vote. This is why it is so important to vote according to a well-formed conscience that perceives the proper relationship among moral goods. A Catholic cannot vote for a candidate who favors a policy promoting an intrinsically evil act, such as abortion, euthanasia, assisted suicide, deliberately subjecting workers or the poor to subhuman living conditions, redefining marriage in ways that violate its essential meaning, or racist behavior, if the voter's intent is to support that position."

"There may be times when a Catholic who rejects a candidate's unacceptable position even on policies promoting an intrinsically evil act may reasonably decide to vote for that candidate for other morally grave reasons. Voting in this way would be permissible only for truly grave moral reasons. When all candidates hold a position that promotes an intrinsically evil act, the conscientious voter faces a dilemma. The voter may decide to take the extraordinary step of not voting for any candidate or, after careful deliberation, may decide to vote for the candidate deemed less likely to advance such a morally flawed position and more likely to pursue other authentic human goods.

"In making these decisions, it is essential for Catholics to be guided by a well-formed conscience that recognizes that all issues do not carry the same moral weight and that the moral obligation to oppose policies promoting intrinsically evil acts has a special claim on our consciences and our actions. These decisions should take into account a candidate's commitments, character, integrity, and ability to influence a given issue. In the end, this is a decision to be made by each Catholic guided by a conscience formed by Catholic moral teaching."

"It is important to be clear that the political choices faced by citizens not only have an impact on general peace and prosperity but also may affect the individual's salvation."

Mark your calendar and set aside sufficient time to vote on Tuesday. Vote your conscience, your informed conscience. A clear conscience is a soft pillow.


